After these explosions there succeeded a most violent clapping of hands, given with a certain degree of time, and then redoubled. These applauses, to which she had been accustomed from the public, did not induce her at first to think much of them; but her friends did for her. One evening they imagined they were watched: it was eleven o'clock; the noise was made under her apartment. It was heard, but no one was to be seen; it could be nothing but a consequence of what had been exprienced. To this succeeded melodious sounds; and it appeared as if a celestial voice accompanied her, which it frequently did, from the Crossway of Bussy, and finished at her own door. At length every thing of the kind ceased, after a period of two years and a half.
