Mulford drew up and presented "A Memorial of Several Aggrievances and Oppressions of His Majesty's Subjects in the Colony of New York, in America." This Paper, which was referred to the Board of Trade, was printed in England, and a number of Copies communicated to Members of the House of Commons. In September, 1717, Gov. Hunter called the attention of the Assembly to this "very strange Memorial," and the House voted it "a most false, malicious and scandalous paper," demanded that the Author be brought to Justice, and, alluding to Capt.
