



Tomatoes were also firm. A reduction had been expected, but most sales were made at 90c to \$1 for 11-quart bas-Plums were offered in large quantities. Plums were offered in large quantities.
Eleven-quart baskets brought from 85c
to \$1, while six-quart baskets sold from
60c to 75c. Quart boxes brought 15c.
Peaches were plentiful and the demand was active. They sold at from

85c to \$1 per eleven-quart basket. Boxes sold at 15c. Thimbleberries sold well at 28c to 30c per quart box.

Green corn was plentiful and sold well at 20c to 25c per dozen. Next week's prices are expected to rule at 15c to 20c, as it is coming in in abun-

dance.

Cauliflowers were dearer today, and most sales were made at 25c. Previous quotations were from 10c to 25c per head. Some growers asked as high as \$150 to \$250 per dozen.

The first large offering of oats on the square this week sold this morning at from \$235 to \$250 per cwt.

Hay dropped \$1 on the minimum price. It went as high as \$30 per ton on Wednesday, but eased off today.
