## "SPECTATOR" IS RAPPED FOR ATTITUDE ON POWER

Ex-Mayor Stewart intimates that Mr. Southam is financially interested in the Cataract.

HAMILTON, June 3.—(Special).—There was another enthusiastic rally this evening at the Savoy Theatre in the interests of the Hydro-Electric bylaw, that will be voted upon Monday. John Milne presided, and as a vote for the bylaw, Hon. J. S. Hendrie scored The Spectator for not reporting the speech he made at the "Twentieth Century Club" Tuesday evening in favor of a Hydro-Electric contract. He again stated that he considered that it would not be the government involved in contracts amounting to \$3,000,000, to back out of the project. They would do well to mix honor with business.

T. J. Stewart, M.P., in a vigorous speech, said he had never referred to "Vim" Southam or his newspaper's connection with the Cataract Power Company, but because of its abuse of him he might mention that Mr. Southam had \$100,000 worth of stock in the company, and he (Stewart) promised them that he did not pay one hundred cents on the dollar for it. The speaker reiterated his statement, in spite of the details, that the company was using within six per cent. now of the amount of water it could use from the Welland Canal. His authority was to be found in Hansard, where the minister of public works had made that statement. All the company would have to do if it got the contract with the city, in order to break its agreement, was to say that it could not generate any more power.

Alain Stodolme said that it was for the ratepayers Monday to either play the baby act and vote for the contract to do the business of the city or to be manly and hitch up with the Hydro-Electric Commission. There were no words in the English language strong enough to bind a company which wished to back out of an agreement, and he left it to them to decide whether the company had been honest in its dealings with the city.

A Lively Strike. The street railway had more trouble to-day with the Italians employed on the Barton-street reconstruction work. Many of them struck for a higher wage than the 15 cents an hour the company is paying, and they chased with pick handles those who wanted to remain at work. A patrol wagon had to be sent down with a number of constables to guard the men who remained on the job and the company's cement mixer. They had to draw their revolvers to quell the disturbance.
