BORDEN AT STRATHROY
DRAWS LARGE AUDIENCE

Pays a Tribute to the Worth of
Rural Members of Parliament
—Gov't Policy Condemned.

STRATHROY, Nov. 8.—(Special).—R. L. Borden, as leader of the Conservative party, speaking on behalf of the Conservative party, drew a large audience to the Strathroy Hotel, where he delivered a long and able address.

Mr. Borden at the outset remarked that this was an occasion for the electors to strengthen the Conservative opposition at Ottawa. The Conservative candidate was a member of a great farming community and in caucus and in private some of the best advice ever given came from the farmers in the party.

"The parliament of Canada," he declared, "will be affected in its usefulness by sending Robert McLaughlin, who I believe will be elected by you on Wednesday."

Answering the declaration that if Mr. McLaughlin went to Ottawa it would be to oppose the Liberal policy, and it would be better to send a man who would have the ear of the government, Mr. Borden deprecated that conception of duty. He asked if the cabinet was master of the country, trustees of the servants of the country, trustees impressed with the purpose and duty, if they were honest, if the spending of money freely in the riding of West Middlesex was according to the interests of that riding, whether a man went to Ottawa to support or oppose the government. Referring to the expenditure of the government in 1898 it was \$428,000,000 and in 1900 \$733,000,000. "Look around and tell me what has become of the added \$323,000,000 in the last ten years? Isn't it time to call a halt? What would become of that if you sent to Ottawa a good practical farmer like my friend Robert McLaughlin?" said Mr. Borden amid loud cheers.

"It is my firm belief that the National Transcontinental Railway will cost the people of Canada one million dollars for every electoral constituency in Canada, and that will mean two hundred and twenty million dollars," he said later in reference to the Transcontinental.

Mr. Borden referred to the various "scandals" that have affected government departments and said: "The policy of the Liberal Government from day to last in connection with the administration of affairs has been a policy of refusing enquiries into alleged wrongs, corruption and wasteful expenditure whenever it thought that such enquiry would be against its interest."

Short speeches were delivered by George Neely, M.L.A., Hume Elliott, London, W. S. Dickinson, mayor of Stratford, and J. E. Armstrong.
