

Ottawa, May 7.—(Special.)—In the Senate to-day, Senator McDonaid of British Columbia enquired whether it was the intention of the Government to give a lease of 100 miles of the Stewart River, In the Yukon District, for 20 years, to a certain company, for the purpose of mining or dredging for gold.
