Re: Mrs. Lillian DOCKSTATER (Indian) Oneida Reserve, Ont.
Neglect in Child Birth and Concealing Dead Body.
(Case handed over to Ontario Provincial Police.)

Headquarters

1. The inquest in connection with the death of the child in the above case was held at London, Ont. on the evening of the 5th instant. Same was attended by Cst. FAHIE and the writer. The Coroner's Jury brought in a verdict to the effect that the child died as a result of premature birth.

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2. On the morning of the 6th instant the Ontario Provincial Police laid charges of "Concealing", under Section 272 of the Criminal Code against the above mentioned woman and her two sons, Clarence and Tommy ANDREWS. All three pleaded guilty and were remanded for sentence until the 13th instant.

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3. The holding charge of "Vagrancy" against Alexander DOCKSTATER was dismissed.

4. Roy DOCKSTATER, younger son of the accused woman, appeared in Juvenile Court at London before Juvenile Judge D.B. MENZIES on the afternoon of the same date and was placed on probation for an indefinite period of time.

5. Witness fees and mileage for attendance at the Coroners Inquest, when received, for attendance of Cst. FAHIE and the writer, will be deposited and forwarded in the usual manner.

6. A further report will be submitted upon conclusion of this case.
