CANADIAN PACIFIC PLANS TO INVADE THE WESTERN STATES

They Have Completed Arrangements with Harriman Lines in Washington and Oregon to Have C. P. R. Through Sleepers--Looks Like Fighting Jim Hill on His Own Ground.

SPokane, Wash., Sept. 10.—Robt. Kerr, of Montreal, passenger traffic manager of the Canadian Pacific Ry., today made a statement, which is regarded as significant by well-informed railroad men in Spokane. He said, among other things, when asked about the probability of the C. P. R. invading the so-called Hill territory in the Inland Empire of the Pacific Northwest, thus obtaining also an outlet to tide water in Oregon:

"We are after the great American dollar, and like all other business men we will meet the wishes of the people in any way that will contribute to business interests. We have completed traffic arrangements with the Oregon Railroad and Navigation Company, operating the Harriman lines in Washington and Oregon, to haul our sleepers from Spokane to Portland."

Asked if it is the intention of the C. P. R. to extend its lines from Spokane to either Portland or the Pacific coast, Mr. Kerr said:

"That is something for the future. At present we have our hands full in Canada. I do not believe our company expects to do anything over here just now, as our arrangements with Mr. Corbin and the service to Portland will be satisfactory, and being such, there would not be any object in building to either of the western points. However, this country is developing rapidly and the next few years may see accomplished many things of which we do not think today."

Mr. Kerr is accompanied by C. E. E. Usher, formerly of Montreal, now assistant passenger traffic manager, with headquarters at Vancouver and Portland and cities in the Puget Sound and Pacific coast country, and passed considerable time in central and eastern Washington, where they inspected the bonanza wheat fields, in which 40 to 80 bushels of grain an acre is being harvested. They also looked over some orchards in Oregon and Washington. They were especially interested in the big combine threshers, drawn by 30-horse teams or traction engines, and cutting over from 50 to 65 acres of land a day. These machines cut a swath 18 feet wide and do everything from heading to pouring the threshed grain in two-and-a-half-bushel sacks and dumping it off at regular intervals. Each machine requires five men.

"From what we saw of the stands of wheat in the Spokane country," Mr. Usher said, "I should say that the estimate of 45,000,000 bushels for the Inland Empire is not over the mark. Reports are that the farmers in the Canadian northwestern provinces have 80,000,000 bushels, so taking the entire northwest it deserves the title of 'the breadbasket of America.'"

"We were deeply interested in the methods employed by the threshermen in the Spokane country, and it is not unlikely that the next harvest in Canada will see a number of similar outfits at work on our western provinces. They not only do the work quicker and cleaner than by old ways, but, I am informed, threshing here is also cheaper. The introduction of up-to-date machines will mean thousands of dollars to our farmers."

Mr. Kerr, who was a guest at the Spokane club during his stay in this city, is not a stranger to Spokane; in fact, in the early days, 23 years ago, he passed much of his time out this way. He has the record for having made the fastest trip on the Columbia river in the Spokane country. This was made in 1900. He said:

"This was my first visit to this city in 10 years, but I know Spokane quite well and was one of the first guests in your leading hotel, arriving shortly after it opened. The city and country have grown in a way that I would not believe had I not seen the progress with my own eyes. Today

there are modern buildings of stone and concrete where log shacks were less than 25 years ago. Substantial business blocks are being erected on all the thoroughfares and your Riverside Avenue compares favorably with the business street of any city in the Pacific northwest; in fact, I may say anywhere in the country. The people are alert and active and do business with a dash that is somewhat refreshing to an easterner."

"Our Soo-Spokane business is growing at a satisfactory rate and we are pleased with this means that in a few years there will be completed to extend the through sleeper service from St. Paul to Portland over the Oregon Railroad & Navigation Company's lines and it is likely this will be put into operation next winter or early the coming spring, giving the C. P. R. three water fronts on the Pacific coast. We already have Vancouver, B. C. and Seattle. On the eastern end of the continent we have Halifax, N. S., St. John, N. B. and Boston. This service, your prominent business men and shippers say, will do much for Spokane, where our patronage is already all that can be desired. This, we believe, will grow as the country is filling up rapidly and the people have money to travel. Our line is the shortest between St. Paul and Spokane, the run being made in 43 1/2 hours.

"The tourist business into the Northwest was larger this year than in any other similar period in the history of the C. P. R., and we are looking for even a greater influx the coming year. With much of these new people will come more capital for investment and building, and this means that in a few years there will be prosperous settlements where the lone coyote waits for the wandering jack-rabbit, and with the introduction of irrigation in the southeastern part of British Columbia and other parts of the Canadian Northwest, so extensively and profitably practiced in the Spokane country and elsewhere on this side of the boundary, there will spring up thriving agricultural communities which will be of immense benefit to the eastern centres and of vast importance to the whole northwest.

"With its immense water power in the Spokane river, estimated at 400,000 h. p., there should be more mills. Your farmers grow much grain and it should be mean much to Spokane as a jobbing and retail centre."

Mr. Kerr had a business conference with D. C. Corbin, president and builder of the Spokane International system yesterday, and they went over the extension of the Soo-Portland service in detail. He and Mr. Usher left on an inspection trip over the system this afternoon and after a short stay at Calgary, he will go to Winnipeg and other points, returning to Montreal about Sept. 16, having covered nearly 15,000 miles since the beginning of his annual trip of inspection of the C. P. R. and lines of its subsidiary companies.

CONCILIATION BOARD IN SPRINGHILL STRIKE MET AND ADJOURNED

The Chairman Wires to Ottawa for a Decision on Company's Point About Employees--Much Will Depend On It.

Halifax, N. S., Sept. 10.—The board of conciliation met again at Springhill this morning. None of the company's side put in an appearance. After yesterday's adjournment Chairman Patterson wired the minister of labor as follows:

"When conciliation board, acting in the dispute between employees and the Cumberland Railway & Coal Company met this afternoon, the company's solicitor objected to further investigation, contending that there was no dispute between employer and employee, the latter being no longer employees, having ceased work on Aug. 1 last, according to their written notice to the company. Reference made to sections 2 and 3 of the act. It appears the men have no claim against the company for back pay and coal out but not measured; it appears also that in April last, when the company applied for a board they considered the men who ceased work as still their employees (see company's application to you, dated April 4). Awaiting instructions from yourself the board is adjourned until tomorrow. Kindly advise me your interpretation of the act on the point raised."

No reply to this was received. Great interest is taken by the men in the point raised by the company that they had no dispute with their employees.

The board decided to reassemble at 4 o'clock tomorrow afternoon. In the meantime the chairman will telegraph the minister of labor to hurry a reply. It will depend largely on the minister's reply and interpretation whether the strike will shortly end or whether it will resolve itself into a fight to a finish.

OBITUARY

Mrs. George Myers
 The death of Mrs. North A. Myers, widow of the late George Myers, of Waterford, occurred on Tuesday, Sept. 10, after a lingering illness, at the home of her daughter, Mrs. F. P. Secord, Penobscot. The deceased was in her seventy-sixth year. She leaves five daughters—Mrs. W. G. Carleton, of Sussex; Mrs. Mary J. Tutin, of St. John; Mrs. W. Yates, of New Hampshire; Mrs. H. F. Secord, of Penobscot; and Mrs. E. H. Frame, of Boston; also two sons—Robert E., of New Hampshire, and Charles E., of Brooklyn. She also leaves eighteen grandchildren and four great grandchildren.

Thomas J. Wallace

Halifax, N. S., Sept. 10.—Thomas J. Wallace, one of the oldest barristers of Nova Scotia, died this evening.

An interesting episode in his early professional life was his disbarment by the Nova Scotia Law Society, then chief justice, Wallace had done something to which Young strenuously objected, and the chief justice demanded an apology. This Wallace defiantly refused to give, and his gown was taken away. It was before the creation of the Supreme Court of Canada, and Wallace appealed directly to the privy council, which reversed the Nova Scotia decision and ordered the reinstatement. The first intimation the court here had of the result of the appeal was when Wallace appeared in court to make a motion. He was a native of Chatham (N. B.). His widow and several children survive.

Russia to Build Four Big Battleships.

St. Petersburg, Sept. 10.—The Novoe Vremya says that the ministry of marine is about to order four battleships of 21,000 tons.

ANOTHER CLASSIC

A Traveller Submits to Mayor Sear's Plan to Keep the City Well Painted and Stylish.

A few days ago the mayor found another letter from "A Traveller," similar in style to several that have been published heretofore in these columns.

The letter is certainly a "classic" and will be highly prized for the profound utterances it contains. No doubt the suggestions in it will receive the attention they deserve from his worship.

Following is the letter in its full glory:

St. John, N. B., September 8th, 1907.
 To His Worship, Edward Sear, Mayor of Saint John, Mayor's Office, Saint John, New Brunswick, Canada.

The following is a "Law" I would like for you to enforce.

The Bankers License Law for Painting Cities.
