Three Recruits
Three recruits were secured in the city yesterday. They were: J. Dempster, Kings county, Forestry Company; A. Richard, Kent county, Canadian Engineers, and A. Rucinski, Poland, Machine Gun Draft.
Lieutenant-Colonel P. A. Guthrie and party of officers, held a recruiting meeting in Bangor last night, and as a result secured twenty-five men.
A total of 248 recruits were secured in the province during the last two weeks. The county totals are as follows: York, 124; Kings, 70; Restigouche, 5; Charlotte, 3; Albert, 2; Carleton, 1, and Westmorland, Northumberland, Gloucester, Madawaska, Queens and Sunbury, and Kent, 0. Of the 124 recruits credited to York county, 111 of them were secured in the United States by the 286th battalion.
The names of three New Brunswick men appear in the midnight casualty, wounded, W. S. Hamilton, St. John; F. J. Gallagher, Fredericton; gas poisoning, C. D. Garnett, St. John.

MORNING NEWS OVER THE WINES
The Nova Scotia Steel and Coal Co. directors have elected Frank H. Crockett, vice-president and general manager of the Tennessee Coal, Iron and Railroad Co., as president. Col. Cantley, the retiring president, becomes chairman of the board. Common stock dividends are resumed with a declaration of 2½ p.c. for the first half of the current year. Shareholders of record June 30 will also be offered \$5,000,000 new common stock at par. The effect of this will be to raise the issued common stock up from \$7,500,000 to \$12,500,000.

This is the anniversary of the great St. John fire of June 20, 1877.
Work will be commenced immediately on the extension of the round house at Bay Shore. Grant & Home of this city have received the contract.
Miss M. Ethel Magee is being welcomed home by her many friends after completing a three years' course in nursing at St. John's Hospital, Lowell.
Friends of Pilot Robert Doherty and Mrs. Doherty called at their home last evening, and presented to them many useful gifts, in the form of glass and woodenware. The occasion was the fifth anniversary of their wedding.
There is now no hope of saving the schooner Edgar W. Murdoch, which went ashore on the Old Proprietor, about 5 o'clock Monday morning, according to a message received yesterday afternoon by J. T. Knight & Co., of this city, to whom the cargo was consigned.
About half the broken timber has been removed from No. 5 shed, according to Contractor E. O. Leahy, who has the contract for removing the freight and clearing away the debris. Of the munitions, 295 cases have been removed out of a total of 8,000 that went down in the crash. City Engineer Murdoch said yesterday that the disaster was due to excess loading. It is said that the damage will not exceed what was at first reckoned upon.
