The many donations received during the summer were spoken of by William McIntosh, curator of the museum. There will be a series of lectures during the coming winter and also a course of round table talks.

Mary Rumley Sentenced

At the October sitting of the Kings county court, opened in Hampton yesterday, with His Honor Judge Jonah presiding, Mary Rumley was given six months in jail for stealing goods from the home of D. G. Lingay at Riverside. She pleaded guilty. Mrs. Faulkner, charged with keeping a disorderly house, was found not guilty by the jury and the prisoner was discharged.

Miss Dwyer said that she had not been called upon to deal with one case during last month. The board also used their power and four houses in the city were ordered to be closed as unfit for habitation.

The Brunswick street church, Fredericton, is not only losing its pastor, but is also losing some valued members by the removal of Frank Creed and his family to Sussex. But these will be warmly welcomed to the ranks of the workers in Sussex, and will find an opportunity for Christian service there.

Mr. Creed is a son of the late Dr. H. C. Creed, for many years editor of the Year Book and secretary of the convention.

It will be no secret to our readers that "Padre 64th," who writes interestingly in this issue of Shorncliffe and its environs, is also known as Chaplain Parker. This letter was written from a hospital in London where he is still confined from the after-effects of an attack of diphtheria. He writes cheerfully that he now hopes soon to be out of bed and on his feet again.

He was one of the first to enlist after war was declared, and served in the ranks of the 10th Battalion, Canadian Expeditionary Force.
