VOLUNTEER WORKERS TO ERECT Y. M. C. A. BUILDING

Winthrop, Mass., Aug. 19.—A building which will be held at the Y. M. C. A. camp at Lake Cobbessecontee in Winthrop Center, beginning on Saturday. Twenty volunteer workers will be present from each of the 16 counties and will contribute two weeks to the erection of the 16 county buildings, Frank A. Rumery of Portland will have charge. One carpenter and one stone mason from each county will be present.

The training centre, to comprise 29 new buildings, a 200-acre site, complete equipment and a large corps of instructors and lecturers, in the plan of the state Y. M. C. A., to train men and boys will be engaged in volunteer work at the state camps the next two weeks. During the building period there will be recreation, athletics, swimming and social sessions.

It was through the training camp that 1,000 boys were trained for farm work during the war period and another 1,000 interested to turn their attention to the production of food.

HARBOR SURVEY OF COMMISSION PLAN ACCEPTED

Terms Offered by Federal Government Discussed by Council—Grandstands for West End And Ends

As a result of an address on Harbor Commission, given before the Rotary Club and published in the press yesterday morning, there was a discussion on the matter at the weekly council meeting of the commissioners yesterday afternoon. Commissioner Bullock and Mayor Hayes both spoke, the former on what the city was doing in the way of trying to arrange for a plebiscite on the important matter of harbor commission, referring to communications from Ottawa to direct queries from the city showing that there was nothing definite in the act of parliament in regard to city properties, particularly the ferry, while His Worship the Mayor stated that he could not follow the figures quoted in the report of the speech to show where the city was receiving \$2,300,000.

The motion of Commissioner Bullock, for the city engineer to make a survey of the city properties in connection with harbor commission, was put and carried unanimously.

Commissioner Bullock introduced the following motion which passed the council.

Another general discussion was engaged in by the city commissioners in regard to the disposition of the stand erected at Reed's Point in connection with the prince's visit to the city. On motion by Commissioner Bullock the West End Improvement League and the East End Improvement League will each receive half of the stand to be erected as bleachers for baseball games. Commissioner Jones urged that a portion of the stand should be granted to the South End League also.

A communication was read from Charles A. Perry, secretary of the Fire Fighters' Union, No. 192, asking the council to arrange for a delegation from their union to appear before the commissioners. Commissioner Jones moved that the council express its willingness to meet the delegation. Commissioner Fisher said that he would advise acknowledging the communication and the commissioner also asked why the request had not come through the commissioner in whose department the fire fighters were. Commissioner Bullock moved that the communication go before Commissioner Thornton, the latter to arrange for a hearing of the association before the city fathers. This motion carried.

Commissioner Bullock asked the clerk to notify in writing Fred A. Dyke-man to the effect that the matter of the Alexandria Heights proposition had been referred to the Town Planning Commission.

A communication was next read from Roy A. Davidson on behalf of the Motor Agency & Repair Company, asking permission from the council to erect a gasoline tank at 69 City road. The matter

AMERICANS WHO FOUGHT IN C. E. F. ARE ORGANIZING

Veterans in Boston Forming a Local Post

Some 40,000 Members Already in Various Parts—Secretary Speaks of Cash Bonus From Ottawa and Figures on \$1,200 at First

(Special to Times)

Boston, Aug. 20.—The army veterans numbering 250, comprising Boston men who crossed the border to join the dominion overseas forces, decided on Monday night to form the nucleus of a local post of the American volunteers of the Canadian expeditionary forces, which has 40,000 enrolled members. E. J. Barry, a Boston attorney, presided. E. J. Donnell, the secretary, spoke of the agitation in Canada to give each man who served overseas in the dominion forces \$2,000.

This bonus, he predicted, might be cut to \$1,200, although later a bill might be introduced making it \$2,000, but he advised his hearers to reckon for the present on not more than \$1,200. Among the aims of the movement, he said, was to show the world that more than 110,000 men had volunteered in this country for the war—men who were not bound by any obligation to do so.

There are twenty-two camps already and upwards of 40,000 men are enrolled.

GEDDES CHOSEN TO REPRESENT BRITAIN

Minister to Attend International Trade Conference in Atlantic City

Washington, Aug. 20.—Sir Eric Geddes will represent Great Britain at the international trade conference in Atlantic City during the week beginning Sept. 29, if the coal situation in England is cleared sufficiently to permit him to leave his post.

Great Britain, France, Italy and Belgium are the only countries invited to send representatives, it having been intimated in advance to the United States Chamber of Commerce that the holding of a trade conference in this country and the extension of invitations to those nations would be acceptable.

It also declared that if the conference should be called persons of great weight and influence would be charged with the duty of representing the countries invited.

M. Clementel will represent France and Signor Crecchi Italy.

It is understood that other nations would like to have delegations at the conference, and the question of inviting them is under consideration.

BIG WHISKEY STOCK IS SEIZED AT WHITBY, ONT.

165 Gallons in Cans Found Under Ties on Premises of Foreigner

Whitby, Ont., Aug. 20.—Chief Chas. P. MacGreevy has made a seizure of a big stock of whiskey, thirty-three cans of five gallons each, on the premises of a foreigner named Urynowich here. The chief has been watching the place for some time, and on Friday night made a search, but succeeded in finding only a barrel full of some sort of mixture which was evidently the "mash" in process of distillation. Later the search was resumed and the chief was rewarded by finding the 165 gallons in cans under a pile of ties. He also discovered caps and labels which were presumably attached to bottles filled with the whiskey. The principal offender wanted by the chief is said to be a man living in Toronto, who had disappeared before the property was searched. The whiskey was being sold at \$11 a gallon.

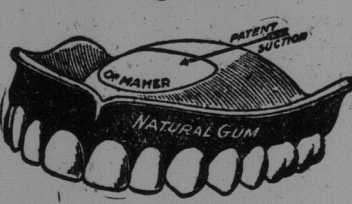

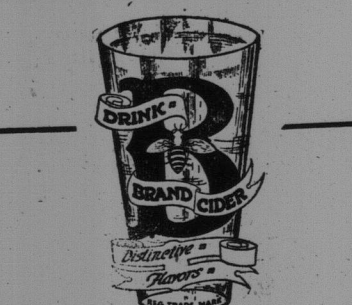

CHARGED WITH HELPING ENEMY ALIENS TO LEAVE THE DOMINIONS

Montreal, Aug. 20.—First steps in the probe of what promises to be a serious state of affairs in regard to passports issued to alien enemies, following discoveries made by Captain J. N. Carter, registrar of enemy aliens, were commenced yesterday before Judge Marin of St. Hyacinthe in the local police court. Two accused are Ioan Thomsone alias Edun Popesco, and Rev. Doistei Constantinesen, two Roumanians. The charge was knowingly assisting enemy aliens to leave the country without first ascertaining

whether they had permission from the registrar.

After some evidence the case was postponed until the 27th, and bail was granted.

Last week Captain Carter discovered that some Austrian subjects were leaving Montreal en route for home with Roumanian passports, and took them off the ship. So far as Canada is concerned the war still exists, the peace treaty not yet having been ratified by Canada.

Suicide, Says Jury

Woodstock, N. B., Aug. 19.—The verdict of the coroner's jury at the inquest into the death of Agnes Montgomery, was suicide by drowning. The inquest was held this evening and from all the evidence at the disposal of the jury the only possible finding was suicide, although it is thought by some that there is some mystery connected with the unfortunate affair and that there may be some further developments.

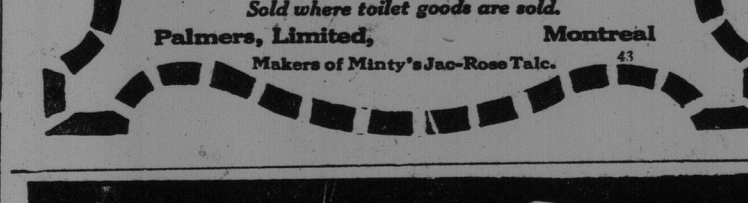

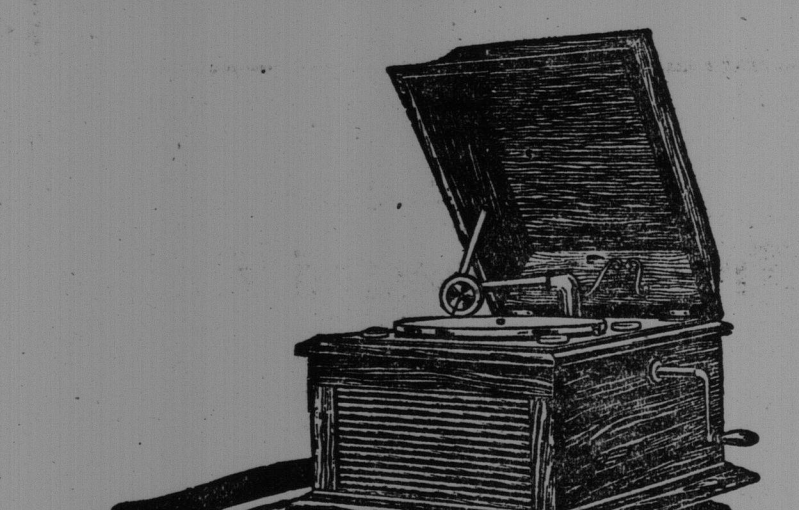
