## PENSION RAILWAY COMMISSIONERS; GIVE PLACES TO TORIES

Ottawa, Oct. 10.—The minister of railways, Hon. Frank Cochrane, will bring down during the coming session a government bill providing for a general revision and codification of the railway act, as amended and amended during recent years. It is understood that one of the new features of the act will be a provision for granting pensions or retiring allowances to members of the railway commission and the staff. The original ten-year term of appointment of Commissioners Dr. James Mills and Hon. M. E. Bernier will expire at the end of next year. The government has in view their superannuation and the new legislation will pave the way. They will be replaced by Conservatives and it is stated that several members of parliament are already angling for the coveted positions.

## PIONEER PLAYER RETURNS

After an absence of a number of years, St. John will welcome H. Price Webber and his company at the Opera House on Saturday evening next. In many respects, the engagement of Mr. Webber differs from the ordinary one. Mr. Webber is a prominent figure in things theatrical about our city. ## SHEEP LED HIM TO WEALTH

Former Officer of British Army, Him ing, Came Upon Rich Gold Quartz

Tacoma, Wash., Oct. 11.—Captain Guest, former officer of the British army, discovered a gold quartz mine, said to be worth one million dollars or more, because he followed mountain sheep whose shadow was reflected on Lake Atlin, Northern British Columbia, from a mountain 6,000 feet above. He climbed the mountain after the sheep, and returning, he found a quartz body of great size carrying high gold values.

The first two carloads of surface ore received at the Tacoma smelter gave returns of \$65 a ton.

Captain Guest went on his sheep hunt last Spring. Since then he has kept fourteen men at work installing a tramway to carry ore to the lake.

Otto Patridge and another Englishman discovered a lode on the opposite side of Lake Atlin and took \$80,000 in gold from one pocket. The deposit is a mass of stringers, some of which are fabulously rich.
