MUSH MUFFINS.

MACARONI WITH BROWN SAUCE.

Boil one quarter of a pound of macaroni in plenty of boiling stock 15 or 20 minutes or until tender. Drain in a colander, sugar, two tablespoonfuls of melted butter, and sufficient flour to make a drop batter. Mix in order given; add one half yeast cake, dissolved in a little lukewarm water, and heat five minutes. Stand in a warm place until light. Half fill your muffer raised and brown on the under side turn and brown on the other side.

MACARONI WITH BROWN SAUCE.

Boil one quarter of a pound of macaroni in plenty of boiling stock 15 or 20 minutes or until tender. Drain in a colander, butter; add two tablespoonfuls of flour; mix until smooth and brown; then add the stock drained from the cararoni (there should be one pint). Stir continually until it thickens, add one tablespoonful of mushroom catsup and the macaroni; stir until it is heated through; season and serve.
