No Student shall be entitled to rank in the first class in Honours who has not obtained two-thirds of the maximum of marks at which the examination is valued.

The first Scholarship of the First and Second years, and the Gold Medal shall be awarded to the Student who stands first in the first class in Honours in the respective years, provided always that the candidate for the Gold Medal has obtained three fourths of the result of the examination.

The remaining Scholarship and the Silver Medal shall be awarded to the Students who stand next in rank in the first class in Honours.

Certificates of Honour* Standing will be given to Students who have been placed in the first class, but have failed to obtain Medals or Scholarships.

Elocution and Music will not be taken into account in awarding the Scholarships, as special prizes are connected with these subjects. The Critique Sacré will be reckoned at the same value as the English subjects with which it may be exchanged in the various years.

The following prizes will be given annually for proficiency in Elocution and Music, the prizes to consist of books selected by the successful competitor, appropriately bound and bearing the College Stamp.
