The Grand Chancellor then installed the officers for the ensuing term, Past Chancellor Cleveland acting Grand Prelate and Past Chancellor Cooper acting Grand Master-at-Arms, when they were escorted to their respective stations by the acting Grand Master-at-Arms.

On motion of Grand Vice-Chancellor, the Grand Chancellor, Grand Master of Exchequer and Grand Keeper of Records and Seal were tendered the thanks of the Grand Lodge for their valuable services during the past term.
