# MONTREAL HAS QUIT THE FOR THE DUNDEE-GRAND CIRCUIT

Cleveland, Ohio., Jan. 11.—On account of the war Montreal has dropped out of the Grand Circuit, it was learned today at the annual meeting of the circuit stewards here. The two weeks usually allotted Montreal were split up between Cleveland and Columbus by the schedule committee. It was announced that war conditions made it inadvisable to hold a meeting in the Canadian city.

According to the schedule adopted today, the circuit season will be open ed with the meeting in Cleveland, July 17, and will close at Atlanta, October 16.


