Bought Sugar Cargoes.

The S.S. Orinda arrived in port yester-
day morning from Cuba with 10,200
bags of raw sugar. The S.S. Inca
also arrived from San Pedro with
12,265 bags of raw sugar. The Inca
is discharging at the refinery pier and
the Orinda is waiting her turn, lying
in the street.

United Kingdom.

Vessel Totally Destroyed.

Pilots who returned last Sunday
from the Lower Mobile Bay report
that the bark City of Bloor, set on
fire by an explosion last Wednesday,
later burned to the water's edge and
sank.

Urges Private Ownership.

The committee of the American
National Merchant Marine, in a ses-
sion held last Saturday, urged the
sale of all vessels owned by the gov-
ernment, and favored the private own-
ership of all ships.

South American Trade.

Twenty-three American vessels ar-
riving at the port of Buenos Ayres
within ten days is a point being held
out by that port as an evidence of
growing trade between the United
States and South America.

FREE EVENING

SCHOOL TO OPEN

Will be Held in King Edward

and Centennial Schools for

Men and Boys—Opening

on Monday Next.

On Monday evening, September 29th,
the local School Board will open the
free evening schools for boys and
men in the King Edward School,
corner of St. John and Wentworth
streets, there will be classes in read-
ing, writing, spelling and arithmetic.
In the Centennial building, on Brus-
sels street, mechanical drawing will
be taught.

These schools afford a splendid op-
portunity for boys and men to improve
their education and thereby increase
their earning capacity, and no doubt
large numbers will take advantage of
this generous offer. Parents who have
sons with a limited education should
urge them to enter. Those who have
never attended school will be gladly
received and taught to read, write and
spell. Arithmetic and writing will re-
ceive special attention.

A fee of two dollars (\$2.00) is col-
lected from each pupil on enrollment.
This, however, is refundable on the
basis of attendance. If a pupil does
not miss any time his entire fee is re-
turned to him at the end of the year.
About one-half of his fee is returned
at the end of the first half of the year.

In past years many business men
strongly recommended the free night
schools to boys and men in their em-
ploy who were handicapped in life by
lack of education. Following this ad-
vice, many enrolled in the school and
in the course of a few months their
services became more valuable to their
employers and consequently they re-
ceived increases in their salaries.

Those who wish to enroll should pay
their fee of two dollars to Mr. A. Gor-
don Leavitt, Secretary to the School
Board, Union street, or to either of
the instructors, Rex R. Cormier, Prin-
cipal of the King Edward School, or A.
G. Gutter, Principal of the Manual
Training School.

Returned soldiers are extended a
special invitation to attend these
classes.
