

MILLIONS TO LEAVE EUROPE FOR AMERICA

New York, Dec. 9.—Fifteen million men, women and children of all social and economic classifications, representing every nationality in Europe, are fighting for passage to the United States, according to reports submitted to seventeen trans-Atlantic steamship company representatives by Frederick A. Wallen, Commissioner of Immigration at Ellis Island.

Every seaport city and town along the western and southern coasts of Europe, they said, is crowded with persons, who in their eagerness to leave for the United States, have sold their homes and everything they possessed. Passport officers abroad are reported to be besieged with applicants.

They also expressed the opinion that 5,000,000 Germans and Austrians

are packed up and ready to sail as soon as the United States makes peace with their governments.

EXCURSION TO THE PENITENTIARY

Three Young Men and Two Boys Will be Conducted to Dorchester Today.

Three young men and two boys will be taken to Dorchester today to serve terms totalling nearly thirteen years in the penitentiary there. John McLean, who has already done time at the Boys' Industrial Home, will go up for a three-year sentence for trying to obtain goods on false pretences from Amdu's. Waiter Paxton and Herman Wilson, who were found guilty of burglarizing Kincaid's grocery store, will each serve two years. Hiram Briggs and George Phaire were sentenced by Magistrate Adams of Brookville for running away from the Boys' Industrial Home, and for being nuisances while incarcerated there. Briggs, who is sixteen years of age, will serve a term of two years and nine months. Phaire, who is only fourteen, will serve three years and two months.

They will leave on the seven o'clock train this morning in the custody of Turnkey Cunningham and Detective Donahue.

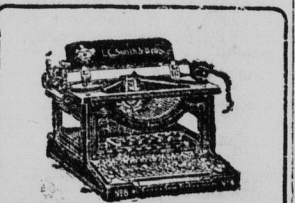
