FIFTIETH ANNIVERSARY OF THE CHURCH OF THE ASCENSION CELEBRATED AT APOHAQUI

Parishioners Carried Back in Thought to the Commencement of Their Church History, Which Dates to 1840, When the First Church Was Consecrated by the Lord Bishop of Nova Scotia.

Apoquaq, May 16.—During the recent days parishioners of the "Church of Ascension" have been carried back in thought to the commencement of their church history...

Seeing the pressing need of a "House of God" a number of the faithful conferred with another, which resulted in the decision to draw up a petition having as its purpose the erection of a church...

At a purpose, at or near the mouth of the Millstream and not far from the house of Mr. Williams Fairweather, write under and promise to conform to the following rules and regulations.

As soon as a sufficient number of subscribers say twenty shall be obtained, a meeting shall be had, at some suitable place hereafter to be named, at which time a treasurer shall be appointed whose business it shall be to receive all monies which shall be contributed for the above object.

Every subscriber agrees and promises to pay into the hand of the treasurer two shillings and six pence every three months or quarterly...

The receiving person shall be appointed Trustees by the subscribers whose business it shall be to receive all monies from the Treasurer and let it be on interest delivering it into the hand of some safe persons as often as a favorable opportunity shall offer.

If any subscriber shall wish to withdraw his name from the subscription list and cease being a member of the apostition such person shall signifiy his intention at his payment of the last quarterly due, and shall forfeit whatever he may have already paid.

If it should so happen that the money so paid into the hand of the Treasurer should not be appropriated for the erecting of a church, then such subscriber shall receive his money back with the interest it shall have accumulated.

And shall signify their wish to the trustee, the trustee shall call such meeting giving ten days notice.

In the course of time the efforts of these God-fearing men were crowned with success, when after a tedious and strenuous period of twenty years, their church was completed in 1840, having as its earliest vestry men the following who have long since passed to their reward.

In his discourse the eminent divine portrayed the essential characteristics of the church, which are similar to those of a city, in that they have a founder, an authoritative power, an unbroken continuity, etc., though many changes have taken place in the 2,000 years since its foundation, and likewise the city. Touching on the Reformation, the speaker likened the church to a ship coming into port laden with sea-weed and barnacles.

The concluding remarks, the Bishop made reference to Brother Thoe's striking characteristic of Methodism and strongly upheld a missionary spirit in the church. Psalms 84, 122 "My Hand, Oh God, has Guided," and "My God, Thy Name" were the hymns rendered, as was also the Te Deum at the conclusion of the service.

The present at the anniversary service, who had attended the consecration services fifty years ago were: Mrs. Edmund Parlee, Mrs. Nelson Secord, Mrs. Mary Lison, Mrs. Beverly I. H. Thoe, Mrs. Zacheariah Parlee, Miss Cornelia Sharp, Messrs. Geo. H. Sharp and J. T. H. Pearson, who occupied front seats, except Mr. Pearson, who preferred to occupy the same pew he had at the service fifty years ago.

Many from outside places attended the services, some drawn by tender sympathies, others by curiosity, and with sacred memories which cling around the graveyard without where many sleep. Substantial contributions were laid upon the plate during the service, and a gift of \$50 from Orme Sharp, of Hartford, Conn., and \$25 from William Garvin, of St. John were thankfully received into the church fund.

At the close of the service the congregation was invited across the way into the Medley Memorial Hall, where a social hour was spent during which many were privileged to talk with His Lordship Bishop Richardson, and others met old friends and much enjoyed the hour. Delicious refreshments were served by the ladies of the "Church of Ascension."

NEW ANTI-BOYCOTT MOVEMENT LAUNCHED

Belfast, May 16.—A new anti-boycott has been launched in Belfast by a body styled "The Ulster Trades Defence Association." The organization has issued a manifesto complaining that the Provisional Government in Ireland has failed to deal with "the wanton destruction and looting of Ulster goods" entering British territory.

GERMANS TRYING TO SHIFT BLAME UPON AUSTRIA

Evidence Brought Out in Kurt Eisner Libel Case to That Effect.

Berlin, May 17.—The German Government public opinion have organized a big-scale campaign against the charge of German guilt for the world war, using the verdict just rendered in the Kurt Eisner libel case as a basis.

Testimony showed that Eisner cut from the documents various references indicating that the German Government tried to localize the conflict and at a late stage of pre-war preparation recommended moderation to the Austrians.

Leading parties in the Bavarian Diet already have introduced an interpellation asking the Bavarian Government to concert measures with the Federal Government to communicate the results of the trial to the Governments of the world and to organize worldwide propaganda.
