

at the bottom of the procès verbal, to which he shall sign his name, or if he cannot write, shall affix his mark before two witnesses, and the procès verbal shall remain eight days at the Surveyor's house, for the information of the persons interested therein, and shall be afterwards registered in the Grand Voyer's office, with the certificate annexed to it, and the Grand Voyer or his Deputy shall make mention in the procès verbal, of the day that he will prosecute the ratification, in the Court of General Quarter Sessions of the Peace, and shall deposit the procès verbal in the Clerk's Office of the said Court, eight days at least before the day fixed for its ratification, in order that the persons interested may obtain a copy, and prepare their means of opposition, if any they have; and after the day so fixed for the ratification, no opposition shall be received, and the said Court shall then, or any other day it may rule, hear the Grand Voyer or his Deputy, and the opposers or those interested, if any appear, and shall do justice as well in the ratification or rejection of the procès verbaux, in the whole or in part, and the judgment shall be given to the Grand Voyer, by the Clerk of such Court, within eight days following, to be annexed to the Register of procès verbaux, in the office of the said Grand Voyer, and afterwards a copy thereof to be delivered by him or his Deputy, to the aforesaid Surveyor, to be put in execution.—*Sec. 20.*

The Grand Voyer is to prosecute the ratification of his procès verbaux.

All procès verbaux, &c. to be delivered to the Grand Voyers.

And Duplicates of their receipts to be transmitted to the Secretary's office.

All public Officers, or other persons having in their possession, any original Procès Verbaux, Registers or Minutes, (either ancient or modern) concerning the Highways, are forthwith to deliver them into the hands of the Grand Voyer of their respective Districts, taking receipts for the same, specifying the original Procès Verbaux, Minutes and Registers so delivered up. And Duplicates of all such Receipts, are to be transmitted by the Grand Voyer
