

## An Act to amend the Militia Act.

HER Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

1. Section 41 of *The Militia Act*, chapter 41 of the Revised R.S.C., c. 41,  
5 Statutes, is repealed and the following is substituted therefor:— new s. 41.

“41. In and for each of the twelve military districts here- Command

“2. There shall also be appointed in each of the military Staff and  
districts aforesaid such staff officers and such other officers. other officers.

“4. Her Majesty may adopt such designation or name of Change of  
office as Her Majesty thinks proper for the officer who com- designation.  
20 mands the militia in any district, and may, from time to time,  
change such designation or name of office.”

2. Section 45 of the said Act is repealed and the following New s. 45.  
is substituted therefor:—

“45. Officers holding commissions as Lieutenant-Colonel in Officers on  
25 the Militia may be transferred to the retired list with honorary retired list.  
rank not exceeding that of Colonel, and officers now on the  
retired list holding commissions as Lieutenant-Colonel may be  
promoted to the rank of Colonel, under regulations approved  
by the Governor in Council.

30 “2. Officers from the retired list may be re-appointed to the Re-appoint-  
active list or such other list as is from time to time authorized; ment.  
but no officer so re-appointed shall be compelled to serve in a  
lower rank than that with which he retired.”

2. Section 47 of the said Act is repealed and the following New s. 47.  
35 is substituted therefor:—

“47. In time of peace no person except the officer com- What shall be
