III. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that if upon due service of such order or summons upon such tenant, sub-tenant or other occupier, he shall not appear as commanded; or appearing, shall not show sufficient cause to prevent execution of such order or summons as aforesaid, such Justice shall order and direct that such tenant, sub-tenant or occupier, shall, within a delay of not less than

days, to be there by such Judge assigned; leave and abandon such house, outliouse or other tenement, to the Proprietor or Lessor, and that in default thereof, the tenant, sub-tenant or other occupier; after the expiration of the delay assigned, be dispossessed and put out of the same, so as to enable the Proprietor or Lessor freely to re-enter, possess, occu-

py and enjoy the same.

IV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that if after due service of such order and direction as last-mentioned upon such Tenant, Sub-tenant, or other Occupier, or if after diligence used to that effect, it be made apparent that such Tenant, Sub-tenant or other Occupier, has taken means to evade such service, the Justice by whom such order and direction was given, or any other Justice of the same Court of King's Bench, may, in case of disobedience to, or non-compliance with such order and direction, issue a Warrant to any Bailiff, Consiable, or Peace Officer of the District, commanding him to dislodge and dispossess such Tenant, Sub-Tenant or other Occupier of the House, Out-house, or other Tenement, wrongfully detained and occupied, and to put the Proprietor or Lessor into immediate possession of the same, and all Officers of Militia, Peace Officers, Constables, and others. his Majesty's subjects, are hereby required to be aiding and assisting, if need be, in enforcing and executing such Warrant, doing the least possible damage or injury to the furniture and effects of such Lessee or Tenant.

V. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the proceedings under this Act shall be summary; nor shall the costs, exclusive of unavoidable disbursements in dispossessing any such Tenant, Sub-tenant, or other Occupier, exceed in any case the sum of

currency, which shall be levied by Warrant of Distress under the hand of any Justice of His Majesty's Court of King's Bench, and by sale of the Goods and Chattels of the wrongdoer. Provided always, that nothing in this Act contained, shall authorise or compel any Justice of His Majesty's Courts of King's Bench, to give any such order or direction as herein above-mentioned, in any case wherein it may plainly appear to him that the Tenant, Sub-tenant or other Occupier as aforesaid, may have a right of property in the House, Out-house or Tenement in question, and that his possession and occupation of the
