Can Lit comes up short

The Second MacMillan Anthology John Metcalf and Leon Rooke, Editors MacMillan of Canada \$16.95 softcover

This anthology is likely a textbook in CanLit courses. If it is, remind me not to take

The book consists of several parts: fiction (short stories and excerpts from longer works), poetry, two substantial sections on writing, plus a short review of the year in Canadian letters.

Some of the fiction is quite good, including a piece called "Unacceptable People" by the U of A's own Greg Hollingshead. For those of you who may be wondering, I've never had Dr. Hollingshead for any classes, so I'm relatively unbiased. Unfortunately, there was much dross, and little gold.

The poetry is dominated by an inaccessible collection called "The Edvard Munch Poems" by Don Coles, a series of pieces about paintings by the famous and inaccessible Scandanavian artist; and "The America Poems" by J.A. Hamilton, each preceded by its own little curious statistic, gleaned from Harper's. Unfortunately, the stats are better reading than the poetry. ("Number of Americans currently frozen in the hope of one day coming back to life: 13", versus "I am/stiff/as a corpse,/stiff as a steak. A real frigid girl./ /Knock on my womb,/my ovaries clank...

The lack of depth and variety of the collections made me apprehensive about the discussions on the state of writing in Canada. One is called "Confounding the Dark: A Symposium on Canadian Writing". It is a waste of good paper, consisting of little more than repetitive name-dropping by much of the CanLit "celebrity" panel, who are supposedly answering such breathtaking questions as "Can you identify any influential movements/trends/fashions (domestic and/ or international) in contemporary Canadian writing?". Not surprisingly, this is dull stuff.

After all, it is absurd to try and identify trends while they're happening

The jewel of the book is the section titled "Position Papers: Statements on their craft by 37 Writers." There is no quicker way to peg an author than to get him or her discussing his or her writing, and this collection is a perfect example. In the middle of beautiful explorations of their own psyches, by many of these writers, are lumps such as the following:

"Everywhere it seems there is an impatience with the conventions of literary realism, and with good reason, for the 'real world' is too often shown as fragmentary, a sort of secondary lesion of the senses, trailing off in diminuendo..." -Carol Shields. I'll be rushing out to buy her book, real soon. How anyone can write that and not feel embarrassed is beyond my comprehension.

I think the problem with this book is that it is an annual. There are simply not enough good Canadian writers around, given this book as a sample, to fill 300-plus pages of excerpts and analysis once a year. Unless you read Canadian out of some sense of duty, this is not an absorbing read, even for a writer. Give me the greatest writers in the world instead, and if one or more of them happen to be Canadian, then I'll wave our flag. This book makes me want to wave a white flag, instead.


