- (c) To make regulations respecting the administration of the department of military records, and the use of such records by the public.
- (d) To report annually to the Governor-in-Council.

 through the Secretary of State, and to recommend such legislation as may be deemed expedient.

DISPOSITION OF WAR TROPHIES.

The information in possession of the commission as regards the quantity and description of war trophies is still more incomplete.

Many applications for distribution of such trophies
have already been received from municipal corporations and
educational institutions, etc., in different parts of the
country in nearly every province and the number is daily
increasing. The commission recommends that measures be taken
to ascertain the number and description of such trophies through
the Minister of Militia at the earliest date practicable.

It is understood that measures have been taken for the establishment of an Imperial War Museum in London, England, and it is the opinion of the commission that a sufficient and suitable selection from the trophies captured by the Canadian Corps should be deposited there as an evidence of the share taken by Canada in the war.

It is further recommended that:

- (1) A representative selection be made of such collection of trophies for the establishment of an appropriate Memorial War Museum at the capital of the Dominion.
- (2) The construction of a group of suitable buildings as a Memorial War Museum for the reception of these trophies.
