Sir:-

Referring to your letter of the 30th ultime, I beg to say that your account for travelling expenses will be allowed as reduced by you. Experience has proved that it is not practicable for an Inspector to use an automobile to inspect Agencies and Reserves, and it has been decided on a uniform standard of allowing such expenses. The statement made in your letter that owing the breaking up of your machine and the trouble kept you from returning completing your inspection of the Agencies, is sufficient reason why the Department should not continue to pay for expenses of travelling in an automobile on inspection trips.

In future the department will allow you the expense of ordinary travel, living and travelling expenses.
