Mr. M. Campbell, Farming Instructor at Swan Lake Indian recerve, writes that there is a number of American Indiane at present on that reserve; also some half-breeds, who are trying to get a footbold on the receive by sarriage with Indian women belonging thereto, and otherwise. These half-breeds he saye, bring whiskey on the reserve, and help to est their Indian friends out of everything they raise.

It is your duty to warm off all trespansors from the reserve , and Mr. Campbell should have reported to you in this matter. A half-breed who marries an Indian woman of the bund dose not by his sarriage obtain any legal right to live on their reserve.

You should take steps to remove from the Awan Lake reserve all who are not members of the band; if there are any doubtful cases, you ought to report their circumstances to the Department for instructions.
