

Q. Could that have been from the 18th till the 21st of June?

A. It could have been.

Q. What did you do those two or three days you were away?

A. I tried to get back to where my logs were and get settled up.

Q. Can you recall whether or not you were on pass from A 16 on the 17th of July, 1944?

A. Yes, sir, I believe that was the weekend I had off.

Q. And do you remember when you should have been back here at this centre?

The accused does not answer the last question.

Q. You say that was the weekend you were on pass from A 16?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. You came to A 16 on the 15th day of July, 1944?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Does that seem reasonable to you?

A. I think it does, sir.

Q. And on the 15th of July you were given a weekend pass I understand? Does that sound reasonable?

A. Not at Currie, sir.

Q. How many days were you at Currie?

A. I came here on Friday afternoon.

Q. That was about the middle of July?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. How many days did you remain here that time from the 15th of July?

A. I think, sir, it was on Monday or a Tuesday - it was two or three days.

Q. And then at approximately the 17th of July, did you illegally absent yourself from A 16 Canadian Infantry Training Centre, C.A., at this centre here?

A. I got a pass for the afternoon until 6 o'clock.
