CROSS-EXAMINED BY THE PROSECUTOR

- Q. Were you absent without leave from 0600 hours on the 19th July, 1944, until 2230 hours on the 8th September, 1944?
- A . Yes sir.
- 2. You went absent from the Brockville Rifles at Aldershot? Α.
- Yes sir.
- Q. Before going absent without leave what was the position of your unit at Aldershot? A .
 - I don't know what you mean.
- Q. What was taking place?
- A. They were preparing to leave.
- Yes, and among the preparations for the departure had draft warnings been given to the troops? 0.
- I don't know sir, I had just joined the unit a day or two Q.
- Well let me put it this way Had you been warned for draft? A. No sir.
- You hadn't? A. No sir.
- Were you only with the unit a couple of days? 4.
- A. Yes sir.
- You knew where they were going?
- Α. No.
- Q. Your information has come since then?
- A. Yes, I have heard.
- Did you now they were on the point of moving some place? Q. A .
- Yes sir.
- And you went absent on the 19th July? Q.
- A. Yes sir.
- Now to whom did you apply for leave? Q.
- I expected we would be getting an embarkation leave there sire A.
- You expected embarkation leave, but did you apply for any Q. leave or not?
- We applied for embarkation leave.
- Q. You did apply for it?
- Yes sir.
