CAP. XI.

An Act to grant to the Ladies of the Order of Charity of the City of Montreal, a Sum of Money, for the purpoles therein mentioned.

((17th March, 1814.)

MOST GRACIOUS SOVEREIGN:

Preamble.

THEREAS the expences incorred by the Ladies of the Order of Charity of the City of Montreal, in the Relief of the Infane Persons and Foundlings committed to their care, did in the last year, exceed the amount by them for that purpose received from the Government of this Province, by the sum of Three Hundred and fifty eight Pounds, current money of this Province, and that it is just to repay to them the sums of Money by them so advanced; May it therefore please Your Majesty that it be enacted and be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Affembly of the Province of Lower Canada, conflituted and affembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the Fourteenth year of " His Majesty's Reign, intituled, " An Ast for making more effectual Provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North America," and to make further " provision for the Government of the said Province;" And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that it shall and may be lawful to and for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor or Person administering the Government of this Province, for the time being, to pay or caule to be paid, by a Warrant or Warrants under his Hand and Seal, to the Ladies of the Order of Charity of the City of Montreal, from and out of the unappropriated monies, which now are or hereafter may be in the hands of the Receiver General of this Province, the sum of Three Hundred and fifty-eight Pounds, current money of this Province, to reimburfe the sums of money by them advanced, as aforesaid.

Governor empowered, to pay £358, to reimburse the Ladies of the Order of Charity the like sum advanced by them.

Money applied to be accounted for to His Majesty. II. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that the due applicacation of the said sum of money shall be accounted for to His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, through the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, for the time being, in such manner and form, as His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors shall direct.
