To have, hold, exercise and enjoy, the said Office for and during our pleasure, and his residence within our said Province; together with all the rights, privileges and emoluments, unto the said place belonging, or in anywise appertaining.

In Testimony Whereor, We have caused these our Letters to be made Patent, and the Great Seal of our said Province to be hereunto affixed: WITNESS our trusty and wellbeloved SIR GEORGE ARTHUR, K. C. H. Lieutenant Gvernor of our said Province, and Major General Commanding our Forces therein, at Toronto, this seventh day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, and in the second year of our reign.
