Read, as engrossed, the Resolutions of Appropriation of the 20th instant.

Ordered, that Mr. Ward take the said Resolutions to the Council, and desire their

concurrence thereto.

Ordered, that Mr. Campbell be a Committee to communicate to His Majesty's Council, that the House have agreed to the Address to His Majesty, prepared by the Joint Committee of the Council and House of Assembly, praying a repeal of so much of an Act at the Imperial Parliament of the 13 Geo. 2, c. 7, which requires Aliens to take the Sacrament before naturalization.

Mr. Scott moved for leave to bring in a Bill to provide for the erection of Fences with Gates across Highways leading through Intervale Lands in the Parish of Salisbury, within the County of Westmorland, where the same may be found necessary.

And upon the question, the House divided, and it was carried in the affirmative.

On motion of Mr. Crane.—The House went into Committee of the whole, in further consideration of the Reports from the Provincial Auditor.

Mr. Taylor in the Chair of the Committee.

The Chairmon reported, that they had made further progress in the matter referred to them, and submitted a report, which he read, and being handed in at the Clerk's

Table, was there again read, and is as follows :-

Nos. I and 3. Are the Audits of the accounts of James A. Maclauchlan, Supervisor of the Great Boad from Fredericton to the Canada Line, from 1823 to 1826, inclusive, By which there appears a balance due the Province of £89:5:4½. These accounts appear by the Auditor's Report to be correct.

It appearing by the contingent account furnished by the Supervisor, that many articles and implements where purchased by him for carrying on the work, under his direction; it is the opinion of the Committee he should furnish an account of the man-

ner in which they have been disposed of.

The Chairman further reported, he was directed to ask leave to sit again.

Ordered, that the Report be accepted and leave granted.

The House adjourned until to-morrow morning, at 10 o'clock.

rence thereto.

Mr. Campbell from the Committee appointed to take into consideration and ascertain what sums may be necessary for the improvement of all the communications throughout the Province, and for opening roads to new Settlements, submitted the following report, which he read.

The Committee are of opinion that the sum of £1,150 should be applied for the purpose of repairing the Great Roads throughout the Province, which your Commit-
