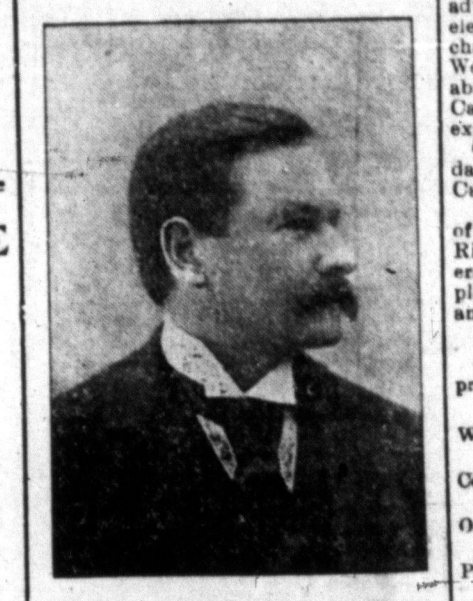

## TO PICK A WINNER

West Kent Conservative Convention Now in Session.

The Candidate and Other Prominent Conservatives to Address the Public Meeting to-night.

The day of the West Kent Conservative convention opened fine and all day long the streets presented a scene of constantly growing activity. Until noon it was rather like a busy Saturday than a political gathering. Few flags floated and no decorations were put out anywhere; but from all parts of the riding came the delegates to the convention, and local Conservatives from every side flocked in to hear the speakers who are to appear in the Grand Opera House this evening. Very many drove, hundreds of others coming in by train, and by the time the convention was called to order there was a full representation of delegates.



The delegates arrived quietly and were allowed to look after themselves until the time arrived to proceed to the business for which they met. There was an entire lack of the too common button-holing, every representative being left alone with his convictions of what was best in the interests of the party. There appeared some diversity of opinion as to who would be the fittest man to represent West Kent in the Ontario Legislature; but upon one point all were unanimous.

The wishes of the majority would be respected, and of the several excellent men named the choice of the convention would have the most hearty support without regard to any personal predilections which might have wished the choice to be other than it was.

The 186 Grand Trunk train from the east brought in J. P. Whitney, leader of the Conservative opposition in the provincial house, and a number of other prominent Conservatives.

James Clancy, M. P., and W. P. Kilbuck are in the city and will be present at the gathering this evening in the Grand Opera House, when a number of Ontario's most eloquent speakers will address the assemblage. The gallery will be reserved for ladies and their escorts.

The Convention decided upon Dr. W. R. Hall, Chatham, to lead the Conservatives of West Kent on to victory in the coming Provincial elections.
