At the police court, Liverpool, a few days ago, a German named Freybank, was charged with failing to register himself as an alien enemy, and with being in possession of five cartridges, the property of the Britsh War Office. His wife was also charged with failing to register. The male prisoner was a lamp trimmer on G. C. MARTIN, H. C. THOMAS.

a British troopship. Police inquiries G.P.A. Hamilton Local Agent as to his nationality resulted in his being challenged on his return to Liverpool from a voyage. He at first declared that his name was Peter Thompson, but subsequently said his name was Richard Freybank, and was a native of Pomerania. He had sailed under the name of Thompson all his life. His wife said she married Freybank twenty-seven years ago under the name of Thompson, and she always believed he was a Canadian. Addressing the Court from the dock, Freybank said he took the name of Thompson many years ago, because he found it difficult to obtain employment in an English ship under a German name. As to the cartridges, he picked them up from the deck of the troopship. The female prisoner said she was British born, and had not suspected her husband's nationality until he was arrested. \* \* \*

While trying to escape from the oncentration camp at Leigh, Lancashire, a German prisoner was shot dead by a sentry. At the inquest, the commandant of the camp said there was some refractory conduct among prisoners, and some of them made an attempt to escape by penetrating through the wall of their dormitory. The attempt was discovered, the sentries were doubled, the strictest vigilance was imposed upon them, and every precaution taken. Those precautions had just been completed when he heard a summons for the guard to turn out. He rushed out and found deceased lying apparently dead, with the medical officer attending to him. He received a report from the sentries and found that they had acted under a Royal Warrant issued in August last regarding the regulations for the maintenance of discipline among prisoners of war. These rules had been issued to the prisoners thmselves, and were perfectly well known by them. Under those regulations, if prisoners attempted without permission of the commandant to pass a boundary, and disregard warnings, they could be fired upon,



SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS. THE sole head of a family, or any male

over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominiou land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made it any Dominion Lands Agency (but not sub-Agency), on certain conditions. Dutler—Six months residence upon and ultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within the miles of his homestead on a farm of it least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader is good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead pat-nt; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-mption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$3.00 per tere. Duties—Must reside six months in ach of three years, cultivate 50 acres and rect a house worth \$300.

The area of cultivation is subject to re-luction in case of rough, scrubby or stony and. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
