BRITISH NEWS

At the police court, Liverpool, a few days ago, a German named Freybank, was charged with failing to register himself as an alien enemy, and with being in possession of five cartridges, the property of the British War Office. His wife was also charged with failing to register. The male prisoner was a lamp trimmer on a British troopship. Police inquiries as to his nationality resulted in his being challenged on his return to Liverpool from a voyage. He at first declared that his name was Peter Thompson; but subsequently said his name was Richard Freybank, and was a native of Pomerania. He had sailed under the name of Thompson all his life. His wife said she married Freybank twenty-seven years ago under the name of Thompson, and she always believed he was a Canadian. Addressing the Court from the dock, Freybank said he took the name of Thompson many years ago, because he found it difficult to obtain employment in an English ship under a German name. As to the cartridges, he picked them up from the deck of the troopship. The female prisoner said she was British born, and had not suspected her husband's nationality until he was arrested.

Old World Notes

The toy manufacturers of the United Kingdom are greatly pleased with the result of the exhibition of the new British-made toys at the Board of Trade Fair. One new firm which has been in business only a few months has succeeded in manufacturing five toys which hitherto have been German specialties. They include the miniature kitchen range with pots and pans which is to be found in every German nursery. One of the novelties shown at the fair is a cannon with machine action which is capable of firing 200 real lead bullets a minute. But there will be no bloodshed in the nursery for the bullets fall as softly as snow. Another success is the series of Hilda Cowham kiddies, one of the quaint wooden figures christened "Dainty Daphne" having been purchased by the Queen. Her Majesty also bought "Curly Locks," an unbreakable doll whose features have been blocked out in relief instead of being merely painted on.

The latest benefactor of Lord Iveagh to the city of Dublin is one for which he will receive universal thanks—He has, with characteristic generosity, requested the British Red Cross Society to equip at his expense the existing spare wards in the Dublin hospitals, which will mean an addition of 167 beds. He has also generously agreed to conform to the suggestion of the military authorities to extend the accommodation for wounded soldiers at King George V. Hospital by the erection of an auxiliary hospital, consisting of huts which will contain 200 beds.

A wealthy beggar was arrested a few days ago in Dublin. He was sentenced to a month's imprisonment for stealing religious emblems from St. Mary's, the Roman Catholic Cathedral. The defendant's son said his father had been in business as a draper in Cork, and had also been a landowner. He sold his land, and was at present worth \$10,000. The police stated that the prisoner was originally arrested for begging from door to door, and the stolen emblems were found on him.

A farmer's daughter of Pilmore, near Youlth, was attacked the other Sunday morning by an unknown assailant, who attempted to cut her throat. It appears that while the girl was entering an outhouse to feed the fowls some person rushed at her from behind, threw a cloth over her head, and drew a sharp instrument across her throat, inflicting a nasty, but not dangerous wound. Her assailant acted so quickly that she did not even see him before she fainted.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

THE sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not sub-agency), on certain conditions.

Duties—Six months residence upon acquisition of the land is each of three years. A homesteader may live within the miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$300 per acre.
 Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after cutting homestead patent; also 50 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions.

A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$300 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$200.

The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony soil. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions.
