HIPPOPOTAMUS HUNTING. Mow the Big Brutes Are Taken and Utilized in Africa.

A hunter of big game in Africa A hunter of big game in Africa writes: "Hippopotamus hunting, as a rule, is not exciting, except from a cance or boat, where the animal has a chance of turning the tables. If a clean shot is made, he sinks like a stone, and beyond a few bubbles on the surface nothing more is seen till he rises to the surface, belly up, in from one to four hours. One can generally tell by the thud One can generally tell by the thud of the bullet if the shot has told. It is mostly snap shooting as they blow, and a novice or excitable per-son will often waste a lot of ammunition banging away at every nose he sees bobbing up, irrespective of distance or position. The vulnerable spot is the brain, and t is advisable to wait for a side shot, when a bul-let in the neighborhood of the ear

will surely find it."
This hunter writes further: "When we camped on the Kafue, schools of from ten to thirty hippopotami were found together, but after being dis-turbed several times they shifted to a huge swamp to the north, where the only way to get at them was by poling canoes through about a mile of reeds and narrow channels to the lake-like patches of open water whither they had retired. The only cances we could get were dugouts, capable of carrying not more than three men, very narrow, mostly rot-ten and parched with lumps of moist clay to stop leakage. If capsized, they sunk like stones. So, as the place was full of crocodiles, we had always a spare cance at hand. We hunted them successfully several times in their swamps."

Being useful as butcher's meat, the

big river horses were hunted systematically. The hunter, Mr. Wright, says: "All the fat which we used for cooking was procured from hippo. We had to feed from forty to fifty natives living on the station during the rains, when grain and native foods were difficult to get, so that a hippo, even if he weighed three tons, soon disappeared into biltong. Hippo make splendid tracks across country big river horses were hunted systemake splendid tracks across country between bends of the river, and the natives dig round, deep pits on these and cover them with branches and earth. The hippo, traveling along at night, drop head first into them."

British Peers Who Are Foreigners. There are several Peers of the realm who, while still entitled to en-joy all the privileges of their order in Britain, have become, to all intents and purposes, foreigners. Lord Taaffe is head of a house which was connected for generations with the noblest families in Ireland, but has now for more than two centuries been seated in Austria. The present Vis-count, who holds a commission in the Kaiser Franz Joseph's Dragoons, the Kaiser Franz Joseph's Dragoons, has no property in Ireland, but owns large estates and two fine castles in Bohemia. Another expatriated Peer is the Earl of Newbusgh and Viscount Kynnaird in the Scottish Peerage, who is known in Rome, where he has lived all his lile, as Prince Giustiniani-Bandini. He proposes to re-establish a connection with Britain by sending his grandson and heir-expectant to finish his education at Christ Church.

The Archbishop of Westminster has become a total abstainer, says The London Chronicle. That is an important piece of social news—the most important of its class made public for many a day. The Archbishop would be the last person to claim any credit for the sacrifice involved by the renunciation of wine as such; but, like Cardinal Manning, Archbishop Bourne has recognized the havoc made among his flock by drunkenness, and as he must preach teetotalism to those who need it, he has decided to practice what he has to preach. The Archbishop's example will, no doubt, be followed, in course of time, by many of his clergy; and it wins for him immediately an increase in the loyalty the Roman Catholic laity has, from the first, ungrudgingly yielded him.
