This has been made necessary by a further increase in newsprint, which goes into effect at the beginning of the New Year, and also the fact that commencing with 1923 and full effect of increased Postal charges introduced in 1922 must be met.

There are indications that there will be a second advance in newsprint in 1923, probably about the middle of the year.
