Take a labouring man working for adminary wases and having to support a family of nine; indeed, Mr. Speaker, I know a man in my constituenc—he is a farmer—with a family of twenty-one. At the present high cost of living, with she high duty on woolen goods and shoes, and with this new tax udded to all these articles if they come above the maximum price at which goods are exempt—and I believe that a good many articles will come above that price even when bought by the poorest people in Canada—it will be atmost prohibitive for a poor man to raise a family.
