## County Affairs.

Mr. Knapp, in a letter in another column, takes issue with Warden Ogden's statements published in our last that either he, Mr. W. W. Wells, or the late Mr. J. B. Peck, gave the Municipal Council any advice, counselling them that they had power to displace Mr. Gallagher from the post of alderman. Mr. Knapp is inclined to think they were misled by Mr. Emerson's opinion, or that they took advantage of that opinion to gratify their own wrong-headedness. If this County is to be mulct in further bills of costs to the legal fraternity and damages to Mr. Gallagher, it is well that the rate payers should know who are responsible for this waste of money.

In commenting upon the action of the general conference at Montreal in prohibiting drinking and the use of tobacco in any form by persons connected with the church, a leading upper province paper has the following rather amusing editorial: It is by no means rare to find men, who by their apparent grasp and knowledge of every thing under the sun, intimate that had the Almighty called them into consultation when he was planning this terrestrial ball of ours, he could have gotten some valuable points from them, but it is rare that we find a body of men who so openly declare hundreds of years after that when the ten commandments were inscribed the Lord was guilty of a serious lack of prudence, that he neglected to tabulate two very iniquitous practices which his humble followers fall into and that they found it to be their duty even at this late day to make amends for what the Almighty had forgotten to do. In the hereafter the ten commandments will be augmented by two more, that a full dozen are now at our disposal. The new ones which the Lord forgot are "Thou shalt not dance" and "Thou shalt not smoke, masticate nor in any manner use the noxious weed commonly called tobacco." We are at a loss to know why these have been added. Surely they belong in the omniscience of Providence, the exact nature and properties of the weed he knew when he inspired the words "Thou shalt not kill" and "It were immoral to use it we would have been told so before the year of our Lord 1890. We would suggest, Mr. Editor, that the maker of the two new commandments, to secure the passage of a law regarding the sale of tobacco, like that bearing upon the sale of cigarettes to minors in the United States, and prohibit the sale of black jack and T. D. pipes to church members under very heavy penalties.

## Lord Stanley in Amherst

GREAT CROWDS GATHER TO MEET THE GOVERNING GENERAL.

On Monday last, a special train brought to Amherst, His Excellency Lord Stanley and suite. At the station the party was met by Senator Bedford, Senator Dickey, Mayor Dupuis, T. R. Black, M. P., Mr. Ketchum, and several town Councilors, and the party was driven to the Court House steps and an address of welcome was presented by Mayor Dupuis, in which he spoke of the loyalty of the people to Her British crown, and the prosperity they had enjoyed under the flag. He expressed a hope that His Excellency would be pleased with the town and the vicinity.

Lord Stanley replied in a most respectful and polite manner to the remarks of the Mayor, and then he spoke of the universal respect paid to the Queen in Canada. On every hand that name was revered, and nowhere more practically than in Nova Scotia. He was pleased to see the people prosperous and contented, an appearance of the great country that he has equalled in the world. He thanked the people of Amherst for their reception, and also spoke of a few words to the school children who were present and sang God save the Queen.

At the close of the speech, Miss Mabel Ellswood presented a beautiful bouquet from the school children. The party were afterwards driven around the town, and at 2:30 took the special train for St. John, the party being under the direction of Mr. Ketchum.

A very pretty arch was erected in front of the post office.

## Canada's Grand Old Man.

St. John's Honor to the Honored Chiefman.  
6000 Persons Applaud His Speech.—The Daily Speculator.

On Friday evening last, one of the largest political audiences seen in St. John for some time gathered in the rink to listen to speeches by Sir John Macdonald and other prominent men. Every part of the province was represented, and fully 6000 persons were in the building. Dr. Barker was in the chair and introduced the different speakers.

MR. SKINNER

said they had an opportunity to hear some of the ablest statesmen as well as some of the finest orators in Canada. On behalf of the citizens of St. John he was proud to bid the distinguished visitors welcome. Wherever the name of Sir John Macdonald was mentioned, almost exclusive of party, the people were aroused to enthusiasm. The people of Canada were a people of high resolve and noble purposes, and always joined hand in hand to carry out every measure when once it had been decided on.

Sir John Macdonald has stood in the forefront of Canadian progress, and beckoning the people to come on. His name is the synonym for Canadian progress, Canadian unity and Canadian nationality.

R. C. WELDON, M. P. P.

was next introduced by Dr. Barker, who read a telegram from Jos. Wood, M. P. for Westmorland, from Port Arthur, expressing regret at his inability to attend, and wishing all success to the meeting and to the grand old chiefman.

Hos. G. H. TUPPER

was received with prolonged applause. He came, he said, as a brother Bismarck to join in doing honor to the grand old chiefman (cheers), when they were all so glad to see him. He had listened with pleasure to a distinguished man (Dr. Weldon), of whom they were as proud in Halifax as were the people of St. John. There was no sign of despair in Dr. Weldon's words, but the hope that is held by the young people of this country from one end to the other. Looking over the period since 1897, no man reading its history calmly and intelligently can deny that Dr. Weldon has a right to a faith in the future and a faith in his country. Supposed official legislation across the border had, in more than one case in the past, proved more inimical to them than to us.

Sir John Thompson

was received with cheers that lasted for several minutes.

He said that the people must realize when he and his colleague from Nova Scotia came here to address a St. John audience, that there existed between Nova Scotia and New Brunswick's state of affairs with which no McKinley bill could interfere. (Cheers.) There was an honest rivalry for commercial and trade supremacy between the two provinces and their chief cities, but there was no jealousy. (Renewed applause.) Taking the present trade legislation of the United States and the present and past attitude of the Canadian government, Sir John showed that the latter had the highest English authorities had acted an honorable part. His present attitude was in keeping with the position the government of Sir John Macdonald had taken since his birth, and had consistently followed with regard to reciprocal trade. The attitude of the American government, however, today lies deeper than mere trade reciprocity. While Americans are proud of their peculiar institutions we are as proud of our British constitution, do so—if they look at Canada, if they look at the policy of the government and the policy of the opposition they will, I feel confident, come to assist in carrying out this policy that I have made that in 1891 or 1892 or whenever the next election takes place (laughter and cheers)—they will assist me in carrying out the policy that I have made that on that occasion the result will be a triumph for the party for the progress for the Canadian party, for the national policy and for the future advantage of our great country. ## Industrial and Commercial.

The Dominion imports for August aggregated \$10,800,000, and the exports \$10,500,000.

Newfoundland proposes to impose a duty of five cents a pound on frozen fish exported in foreign bottoms.

In this week last year the highest price for C. P. R. stock was 75 and the lowest 47. This year the highest was 84 and the lowest 71 5-8.

There is more beet than cane sugar consumed. In 1881 the total of the world's production of cane sugar was 2,000,000 tons, and of beet sugar 1,774,000 tons. In 1890 the total of cane was 2,246,000 tons, and of beet 3,360,000 tons.

Application will be made at the next session of the legislature for the incorporation of the Newmarket Spool and Excelsior Company, limited. The capital stock is \$30,000 and the shareholders are Miramichi and Scotland men.

The American Insurance Companies are very skeptical about accepting risks on property owned by Jews. It has been found, they claim, that the Jews coming from Russia and Poland will insure and burn their buildings as a commercial transaction.

It is said that a new process for extracting aluminum from clay has been discovered which will enable the inventor to place this valuable metal on the market at a few cents per pound. If this be true, a complete revolution will take place in the metallic world, as iron which it now plays an important part.

A recent issue of the Royal Gazette contains notice of the incorporation of a company to be known as the Standard Fruit and Cold Storage Company, and having for its object the trading in merchandise of all kinds, and also the erection and carrying on of works in St. John for the manufacture of flour.

The proprietors, Com. J. H. Byers, of Halifax Co., N. S., have bought part of the farm formerly owned by Mr. John Allen.

Mr. Allen Wells has returned from a visit to his daughter, Mrs. Edgett, of New York. He reports Mrs. Edgett's health much improved.

Mr. Chas. N. Roworth, Upper Cape, has recovered from the effects of his accident.

Mr. Fraser Allen has already shipped more than twenty barrels of cranberries.

Several companies are now at work planning for the utilization of the waste powers of Niagara Falls. Several mills are to be erected and run by the power.

Agribusiness is the title of Theodor's South American article in the October number of Harper's Magazine. Mr. Child visited several of the agricultural provinces of Chile, and made a personal study of their resources and of the methods of farming, fruit-growing, etc., pursued by the inhabitants. feeling that my young lieutenants are always on the watch regarding the administration of affairs—always able and ready to stretch forth their right hand and give a reason for the truth that is in them. I have said to you that I find myself altogether unable to address you at any length, but there is no occasion for it. There is no room for it. The whole field of politics has been taken up and examined and the course of administration, as well as legislation, has been amply vindicated and justified by those who have preceded me. Mr. Chairman, I feel like the Jewish legislator of old who on his right hand and on his left was supported by his lieutenants.
