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QUICKER MAILS TO THE NORTH.

Our business men have long felt the inconvenience occasioned by the slow carriage of the mails to the north. In order that a letter may reach any of the northern towns, it must be posted before 11:30 o'clock, a. m. The letter does not reach the north till next morning. There is no reason why letters should not reach the northern towns on the day on which they are posted. This could easily be done by the government making a contract with the Northern & Western railway company for the carrying of mails.

A letter posted here in the morning would reach Chatham at noon and Baltimore, Baltimore and Campbellton. Our mails now have to pass through St. John. There is no reason for this, at all events there is no reason why we should not have two mails to the north each day. We call the attention of the representative for York to this matter, and hope that he will use his best efforts to bring about what would be a very great benefit and convenience to the people of Fredericton as well as to those of the northern counties. The Northern & Western railway is now making quick trips between here and Chatham, and there is no reason why one mail a day should not be carried by that line.

THE SHELL FISHERIES—THE COMMISSION AT ST. JOHN.

The members of the commission appointed by the dominion government to enquire into and report upon the means of protecting and furthering the interests of the shell fisheries are now well into their work. They have already visited and made all necessary enquiries of interested persons in Prince Edward Island, and of fishermen in some parts of this province. On Saturday they were at Richibucto and obtained the views of the leading fishermen there. On Monday they proceeded to the Miramichi to make further enquiries. From there they will go to the Restigouche and then cross over to Gaspe and work along in that direction. The majority of the shell fishermen so far visited appear to be well interested in the commission's work. They appreciate the importance of some well directed move to further the interests of the industry. For some years past the lobster, in value, has been depreciating in consequence of its gradually decreasing size and for other reasons. To get the view of the fishermen in the different provinces for the remedy of this evil appears to be the object of the commission. Some favor a very stringent system of protection as a remedy, others again advise a complete cessation of shell fisheries for three or four years, and in support of their view instance cases in the United States where, after this course had been adopted, the industry was most successfully handled. The commission, it would seem, are so far much impressed with the latter view, and we will not be surprised to find that they will recommend the cessation of operations for three years at the least as one of the means of promoting the interests of the shell fisheries.

NEWS CONDENSED.

The Crown Prince's condition is improving. The British government are hopeful of obtaining a satisfactory settlement of the Canadian fisheries dispute soon. M. Delafosse denies that he made overtures to Boulanger to lead a coup d'etat in favor of the restoration of the monarchy. The British ship St. John, from San Francisco for Queenstown, has been wrecked off Foulkland islands. The first officer and seven of the crew were drowned. It is reported that St. John Pope Hennessy, recently reinstated governor general of the Mauritius, after several months suspension, has been removed from office. In a speech at London, last evening, Viscount Ouse, secretary of state for India, said the government were determined to hold office, because they could rely upon the support of unionists. The government would utilize all the provisions of the crime's act. The city of Augusta, Ga., is flooded. Loss to the corporation will be \$25,000; to citizens \$50,000; to farmers along the river \$1,500,000. Prince Kew Luang Derawongse, Vangpawak, a half brother of the king of Siam, and suite, has arrived at New York. He left Siam in May. Jerome L. Hill, executor of the estate of the late Wm. ON THE COAST.

Testimony taken at the Anne W. Hodgson Case.
 HALIFAX, N. S., July 30, 1887.—Capt. Knowledge of the fishery cruiser Advance, who effected the seizure of the Anne W. Hodgson at Shelburne, made a statement of the case here today, to be forwarded to official headquarters at Ottawa. The doctor, of course, is inaccessible to the public, but probably contains nothing of importance that is not already generally known.

Capt. Knowledge stated to the Herald representative that he was thoroughly convinced the Hodgson's skipper intended putting to sea without reporting at the Customs House—an act that constituted a violation of law, and rendered him subject to a penalty. The Hodgson was the first vessel he had seen this season endeavoring to commit a customs or treaty violation. He had been informed of previous suspicious movements on the part of the Hodgson, it being stated that she was looking for bait on the Shelburne coast, but on this point he had reliable information on which to arrest her for a breach of the fishery treaty. Capt. Knowledge said he made an examination of the seized schooner, though not a minute or two, and discovered nothing of special consequence. She had some bait on board, but its appearance did not lead him to believe it was of recent purchase. The cruiser Advance sailed to night for the North Bay fishery grounds, and the Intrepid, now on the New Brunswick coast, has been ordered to the same place. The officers of these vessels and those on the Celtic now at Prince Edward Island, are under strict orders to keep a sharp watch for poachers, but to be careful, before venturing to make a seizure, that their victim has committed an unquestionable breach of the treaty. They are to lose no delay in punishing on their prey and taking it to the most convenient port.

The steamer cruiser Acadia, with Commander Scott and Capt. Gordon on board, was on the Cape Breton coast today. Mackel and reported very plentiful in North Bay, and in a few days the grounds will be swarming with fishing vessels. The fish are hard to take, and so far the schooners have fared very poorly, not a single good catch being yet reported.

AFGHANISTAN.

The American's Proclamation.
 Advice from Candahar state that the Amer of Afghanistan has caused a proclamation to be posted in the bazaar in that city informing his subjects that the British government is holding six infantry divisions, each consisting of nine regiments with cavalry and artillery, in readiness to march into Afghanistan to suppress the revolt of the Afghans. The proclamation adds, I can suppress Ghilzais out there, but they remain ready in case Russia takes advantage of the rebellion to invade the country. The Afghans invite the rebels to return to their homes and says he will only punish the chiefs in insurrection. He warns Great Britain against permitting Ayoub Khan to approach the frontier. The opponents of the Amer explain that in issuing the proclamation the Amer is playing his last trump card as the people within his alliance with England more than they value the Amer himself.

THE CANADIAN PACIFIC ROUTE.

The arrival of passengers in New York twenty days from Yokohama, by the Canadian Pacific, must be far beyond the "record." Such dispatch make the new line a very formidable competitor for the business of China and Japan on our own Pacific route, and with the extremely leisurely steam service that connects with them at San Francisco. It remains to be seen how much of this slackness has been due to the absence of competition, and how much, under the pressure of competition, the voyage can be shortened.—Bobbygon Independent.
