The House of Assembly got through the business of the session on Saturday last; but the Legislative Council thought proper to lengthen the session by refusing to go on with their work until last night.

OUR AGRICULTURAL EXHIBITIONS

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EDITORIAL NOTES.

NEWSPAPERS seem to be in luck this year. There is a surplus in the treasury; the prospects for the cod fishery are good, and several sailing ships have returned after short voyages with a million dollars worth of seal fat in their holds.

In our summary of Hon. Mr. Bentley's speech last week we had a misprint as to the cost of rights of way for the line.

The Canadian Pacific Railway put in a hundred extra men to work on the Windsor, Ont., and their line on the 12th inst.; also large forces all along the line.

The budget for the coming year was presented to the Parliament of New South Wales, in Sydney, on the 10th inst.

The Government proposes to abolish all specific duties and impose a direct tax in their stead.

The Government are constructing a tunnel under the falls at Queen Victoria Niagara Falls Park at Toronto, Ont., and an electric railway was three hundred feet long.

Over one thousand immigrants arrived at Halifax on the 13th and 14th inst.

The House of Commons on the 9th inst., 200 to 9, rejected Clark's motion for the Home Rule motion.

The British Postmaster General recently announced in the British House of Commons that, in addition to the submarine cable which the Imperial Government intends to lay between Halifax and Bermuda, the Legislature of Jamaica has agreed to grant a subsidy to a line of steamers running between Halifax and Kingston, and calling regularly at Turk's Head at Bermuda.

On the 12th inst. Hon. Mr. Haggart said that the contract with the Allan for ocean mails was supposed to terminate on April 12th, but the Allan now contend that it holds good till the fast line mail is determined.

The fisheries report was submitted to the Dominion Parliament on the 11th. The total value of fish taken during last year was \$17,400,000, a decrease of \$807,000 from the year previous.

When the items of \$100,000 salary of Provincial Auditor and \$200 for printing and stationery were submitted, Mr. Sullivan said that he thought the Assistant Provincial Secretary should be paid by one person, and that he should be paid \$10,000.

Mr. Sullivan explained that the salary of the Commissioner was fixed by the appointment of the Auditor.

He remarked that the hon. member should introduce a bill abolishing the present proceedings in relation to the Auditor's amendment was shown to the Auditor and the original resolution carried.
