SQUANDERING CITY FUNDS.

The City Council at the meeting of Monday night last agreed to pay the claim of W. C. T. U. of \$500, which has been pending for about a year and a half.

It is the unalterable rule and universal practice, in all Legislatures throughout the Empire, that when there is a vote on a question involving the expenditure of public money, the members of the Legislature are to be equally divided, and the motion was carried on the casting vote of the Mayor.

THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.
