THE WORLD WEAVERS SUCCESS.—A year ago Bismarck was the most unpopular man in Germany, and yet the public informs us that in the recent elections he was returned as representative from no less than ten districts.

Four Fenians are in conflict as usual. It, however, seems to leave no doubt of several Liberal victories, and it is reported that Miranion has met with an overwhelming defeat, in which he exploited through both legs. The French under Marshal Bazaine evacuated Mexico on the sixth of February. Miranion has captured Zeceates, showed narrowly escaped.

A GREAT EXCITEMENT.—The New York Times says that the news of the Fenian riot in London, failed to excite a sympathizing crowd of a hundred persons at any Fenian Centre in New York. And it would be gratifying if we could take this as an indication that the sculleries of the city are not again to be emptied by Fenian collectors of the savings of charitable institutions and workmen.

It is currently stated that the Spanish Government intends to dissolve the Senate because it is too independent. The Madrid court-martial has sentenced to death the editor of the 'Disunion' and seven other persons connected with the 'Alerta.' Constabularia reigns everywhere in Spain.

The Herald's Richmond correspondent says:—A man named Massey was attacked by a gang of ex-rebels, under the leadership of a sheriff named 'D' by, at Waynesville, N. C., recently. He was fired upon forty times without being injured, and, returning the fire, injured a man named Underwood. He then escaped, but the sheriff says he will call out the county to him. Massey was engaged during the war in passing recruits through the lines to the Union army, and stands indicted for that offence. This was the cause of the attack.

MARCH 20.—The steamboat David White, which left New Orleans on Thursday night, for Louisville, with 300 passengers and 400 tons of freight, exploded her boiler, and sank in the Gulf of Mexico, 22 miles south of this city. The forward part of the boat was torn to pieces, and many of the passengers and crew were blown 100 feet in the air, together with fragments of the vessel. The scene is described as heartrending. The wreck of the boat presents a loss of passengers, many of whose names are unknown, as the boats are lost. The boat is completely wrecked.

NEW YORK, Feb. 20.—The Fenian excitement in this city is shaping into serious action. The disorganizing cable telegrams were disseminated, and volunteering was brisk. The Fenian Committee, headed by 'O' Toole,' and other circles held enthusiastic meetings during the evening. Mayor Hoffmann being invited to attend. Fenian meetings declined in a manner that showed he did not approve of such demonstrations.

LONDON, Feb. 20 (noon).—None of the Fenians who participated in the revolt have been captured. None of the persons who were arrested in Dublin on suspicion of being Fenians have been tried, found guilty and heavily sentenced.

LONDON, Feb. 20 (noon).—Her Royal Highness the Princess Alexandra is quite ill to-day with rheumatism.

LONDON, Feb. 20 (evening).—The Princess Alexandra has been confined and safely delivered of a girl.

The war estimates, as presented in the ministerial budget, are largely increased over those of the preceding year.

Earl Russell counters the American Government for pleading for the Fenians.

The Reform measures of Earl Derby form the topic of general conversation. The leading newspapers have editorial articles in approval.

Berlin, Feb. 26.—King William of Prussia will be the emperor of Germany.

Paris, Feb. 25.—It is announced that the steamer of the New Haven and New Orleans line, the 'Herald,' left New York some time during the month of May next.

LONDON, Feb. 26 (evening).—The Government has withdrawn their resolutions on the Fenian Bill, and will bring forward a regular Fenian Bill.

The Bill for Confederation of the British Provinces in North America has passed the House of Lords.

LONDON, Feb. 25 (noon).—The privilege of the writ of *habeas corpus* in Ireland has been suspended for three months longer.

Dublin, Feb. 26.—Capt. McAffarty, formerly of the United States Army, and several Irish members of the Fenian body in America, and a companion of Head Court Stephen, was arrested in this city to-day, on suspicion of having been concerned in the recent Fenian outbreak at Killarney.

Florence, Feb. 26.—The elections which have so far taken place for members of the Italian Parliament, have generally resulted in the defeat of the supporters of Risasi.

MONTREAL, Feb. 27.—Orders were received to-day to disband the water police, known as Government police, and to reorganize the same. The men are to be disbanded to-morrow. Only six weeks will elapse before a new force will be organized for the slipping time. The men are sent to the barracks, and are to be reorganized during the winter.

The latest election reports from Marlborough, Prince Edward Island, are as follows:—The returns are not all in, but it is almost certain that a large majority has been given against the present government. This city has elected Jenkins, Fenwick, at the head of the poll—his vote being 632; Broken, governor, 563; Dodd, gov't, 523; Hyndman, independent, 440. The predictions of the two parties are not yet known, but probably ten of the government candidates have been returned and twenty opposition. Only five or six strong confederates are elected.

THE GOLD DIGGINGS.—So far as new discoveries of gold are concerned, the past has been a quiet week. On Tuesday morning, however, we were shown by Mr. S. Strong of Port Hope a few small specimens of gold which had just been washed out—by some gentlemen who were then engaged in 'panning' some more of the same material—from earth taken from near the surface of his late ranch on the north shore of the St. Lawrence. There has been a great rush of visitors to over the week to the Madoc mines, and the quantity of gold which has been obtained is regular necessary for the extra lines of regular stages from Belleville. A village of 'El Dorado' has been laid out by Mr. Moore on his farm in the immediate vicinity of the Richardson mine, and a number of the lots have already been purchased. A Belle Isle company has finally bought the claim of Messrs. Carr & Johnson to the Richardson mine, and two sets of rival claimants, the law will have to decide between them, before any operations can be resumed there.—Madoc Mercury.
