Montreal Live Stock Market.

July 23

There were about 675 heads of butch-
ers' cattle, 600 sheep and lambs, 100
calves and 50 fat hogs offered at the East
End Abattoir today. Although there
was a good demand, yet prices of cattle
were lower all round, and a large num-
ber were taken from the market unsold.
Cattle shippers took a few good thrif-
ty steers at about 4 1/2c per lb., but very
few butchers' cattle were sold at over
3 1/2c per lb. Common dry cows sold at
about 26c each, or 3c per lb., and lean
beasts down to below 24c per lb., while
it is probable that some of the worst will
not bring much over 2c per lb. Sheep
and lambs were in good demand, ship-
pers taking the larger sheep at about 4c
per lb., and the butchers paying from
3 1/2c to 4 1/2c for the others. Mr. James
Robb sold two extraordinary fine wethers
to S. Price for shipment to Britain.
These wethers were bred by Mr. James
Cowan, of Chataugay, and weighed
over 500 lbs. Nearly \$30 was paid for
these two fine sheep. Lambs sold at
from \$3 to \$3.50 each, with a few very
fine ones at \$4 each. There are no
changes to note in the hog market, fed
hogs selling at about 6 1/2c per lb., and
hogs just from the cars at 6 1/2c per lb.
