We are requested by His Grace the Archbishop to make the following announcement:

His Holiness the Pope has granted a dispensation from the fast for Friday, June 23rd, in honor of the King's Coronation. The Rescript of the Dispensation was sent to the Archbishop of Westminster to be communicated to all the Bishops of the British Dominions, and has just reached His Grace Archbishop Howley. The following is the form of the Rescript:

Our most Holy Father, Pius X., by Divine Providence, Pope, desiring to render more pleasant and joyful, to all the Catholics of the whole British Empire, the Celebrations in honor of the Coronation of His Majesty King George V. of his own personal motion and most ardent good-will, dispenses with all of them on Friday, June 23rd, the day following the Coronation, in the matter of the Abstinence, by which they would be otherwise bound by Ecclesiastical precept.
