LONDON, To-day. Acting under powers conferred by he Act, recently passed by Parliament, the Home Secretary, Mr. Churchill, has issued an order prohibiting the navigation of any air-craft of any description over the County of London on the three days of the Coronation processions and over Windson and London on three other days devoted to events connected with the Coronation. Then penalty is imprisonment for six months or a fine of thousand pounds. The police reguations to insure public safety on Coronation Day are becoming so rigorous as to be almost calculated to deter the general public from any attempt to witness the procession. It is now announced that all the barrier Sensible Books which should be in gates will be closed not later than 8 by seven o'clock. The Admiralty anounces that Coronation Day will be observed in the Navy by a revival of ancient custom, known as "Splicing the main brace," which means the grant of an extra allowance of gro to the men.
