No person shall walk on any portions of the Park except such as are allotted to the pubhe; and any person violating this rule or refusing to remove from portions reserved for plants, shrubs, flowers, or other such purposes, when requested by the Superintendent, shall be liable to the penalty herinafter im-

Any person using obscene or profane language, or any person drunk or disorderly, or behaving in a manner calculated to give annoyance to the frequenters or visitors of the Park shall be liable to the penalties hereinafter imposed ,and may be immediately ejected by the Superintendent or by any Peace
