U. S. FINDS LUMBER TRUST AT THE COAST

The Officials Have Been Making a Careful Enquiry into the Conditions For Some Time.

Washington, D.C., May 22.—For some time the officials have been looking carefully into charges that the so-called trust controlled the price of lumber, and an agent has been at work gathering information for the use of the department.

Every state, county and city, it is said, has its lumber organization, which the officials declare they believe sets the price of the article, as well as to restrict the sale to special individuals.

The so-called combination officials say is one of the most formidable with which the department has had to deal. The point is made that the inquiry under way is in line with the policy of the department of justice to investigate and prosecute combinations, alleged to be in restraint of trade that cause in the high cost of living, without waiting for the decision of the supreme court in the Standard Oil and American tobacco cases.

That such would be the attitude of the government was announced by Attorney General Wickham just after the request made by the supreme court for the reassignment of these cases.

CONTRACTORS READY FOR START ON C. N. R. LINE

General Manager McLeod Confirms Announcement that Contract is Let

Edmonton, May 24.—H. M. McLeod, general manager of the Canadian Northern railway, practically confirmed to a Journal reporter last night that the contract had been awarded for the fifty miles of the main line west of St. Albert.

Mr. McLeod supplemented this confirmation with the statement that the contract was in readiness to commence work, and were only awaiting the final approval of the route of the main line west by the Dominion government engineers.

Start at Stettler this Week

Mr. McLeod arrived in the city from the south on Saturday evening after having made a tour of inspection of the new lines of the company in the south of the province. He left last night for Winnipeg in his own private car attached to the regular C. N. R. train, for the purpose of inspecting the construction operations on the Saskatchewan-California branch of the railway which is rapidly being pushed forward to completion.

Mr. McLeod drove over the right of way from Kindersley to Calgary last week. He was greatly taken up with the country through which that section of the line will pass.

He was of the opinion that the line will open up one of the finest sections of Alberta. He stated that the line of steel will reach Stettler in the course of another week.
