THEY STAND BY SIR HECTOR.

Two reports will be laid before Parlia-
ment on the Langevin-McGreevy scandal.
One represents the views of the Conserva-
tive leaders on the committee; the other
represents the decision of the Liberals. When
the Dominion Government took public
money to buy the services of Mr. Oser,
Q.C., to use all his great skill as a lawyer
to let the Minister down easy, it must have
been made evident to the most unsophisticated
that the object was to whitewash the late
Minister of Public Works. But by many
members of the Conservative party it was
hoped that the administration would think
better of its determination, and endeavor
to live up to the lofty professions of its
leader, as enunciated in recent speeches
in the Senate.The finding of Sir John Thompson and
his associates, given side by side with the
clearly expressed and logical conclusions
of the minority in another column,
will cause wide disappointment not
only to those adherents of the Conservative
party who have been hoping that Langevin
would be censured and punished as he de-
served. It is not enough that the enormous
robberies from the country should be laid
to the charge of McGreevy and his
associates or to Sir Hector's subordinates.
No one who followed the evidence could
reach the conclusion that McGreevy could
live in the same house, and eat and sleep
with Sir Hector for the past dozen years,
and in many ways act as the Minister's
confidential collector and disburser of funds
for political purposes, and leave the Minister
wholly in ignorance of the realities that it
is now confessed were indulged in by the
decamped M.P. If it is contended that such
is the case, it must be pointed out that Sir
Hector was and is a blind fool. Does any-
one take him for that? He was Sir John
Macdonald's trusted lieutenant; he was the
leader of the Quebec Conservatives; his
biographer says that he knew every detail
of business in his department.Parliament cannot honestly accept the con-
clusion of Sir John Thompson and his as-
sociates in the Privileges and Elections
Committee that Sir Hector is wholly innocent
of blame, and that on his wicked partnerMcGreevy, with a subordinate official or
two, must condemnation fall. If such is
the decision of the majority led by Sir John
Thompson, then there should be an end to
the professions of intended punishment for
incapables and boudlers high and low, and
the virtuous Mr. Abbott should go out of
business as a purifier of the public service.IS IT FULFILLMENT OF
PROPHECY?There are those who do not think there is
anything very wrong in seizing Turkish terri-
tory, as the British Government is reported
to have done within the last few days—that
is, provided the other European
Powers are in some way pacified. It may
turn out that the Turkish Government, for
some tangible reason, is not averse to the
seizure. But if this partition of Turkish
territory is to be continued where is it to
end, and how can the Powers object to
Russia sharing in the spoils? There have
been some indications that Turkey had
started on a career of reform, but it
makes little sense very slowly. The trouble
incident to the maintenance of Mohammedan
autism as a dominant power in the country
once more brings out Cobden's prophecy in
a strong light. Addressing the House of
Commons, the great English Liberal said:
"You must address yourselves as men of
sense and men of energy to the question—
what are you going to do with the Christian
population? for Mohammedanism cannot be
maintained, and I should be sorry to see
this country fighting for the maintenance
of Mohammedanism." * * * You may
keep Turkey on the map of Europe if you
like, but do not think you can keep up
the Mohammedan rule in the country. How
would it be to once more restore the
control of Constantinople to the Greeks?

THE AUCTION OF PUBLIC OFFICES.

The Conservative majority of the com-
mittee which tried the charges against Mr.
Cochrane, M.P., have prepared a report
exculpating the accused. As Sir Adolphe
Caron was the leading influence on the
Government side of the committee, per-
haps such a result was to be expected.
But it is not in accord with the evidence.
It was shown most conclusively that Mr.
Cochrane earned out the patronage of the
riding of East Northumberland to the Con-
servative committee, who, with his cogni-
ance, paid an old debt of \$1,700 by the
sale of Government offices for cash. It
was proved that Hedley Simpson gave \$200
for a light house, Arnold Simpson gave
\$200 and a life lease of his farm for a po-
sition as bridge tender on the canal, Wm.
Bown, J. D. Clouston and Thomas Fitz-
gerald gave \$150 each for a similar position.
Robert May paid \$150 for a similar po-
sition, but had his money returned be-
cause the office sellers had run out of
bridges.There was no pretense that these men
were prominent members of the party.
They were in fact so obscure that up to
this traffic in offices they had rarely sub-
scribed a cent to the election funds,
but when the exigencies of Mr. Cochrane
and his friends demanded it—the
accused member being responsible for the
payment of a note taken up by the money
paid by Simpson—these large sums were
forthcoming. Though Simpson only re-
ceived \$400 a year, he was assessed \$200,
and the men who earned \$125 a day during
the season of navigation on the canal were
charged \$125 to \$150. The old plea was
advanced that Mr. Cochrane knew nothing
about the committee's doings, but it was
not sustained by the evidence, and Mr.
Cochrane refused to be put on oath to deny
what was conclusively shown. Two or
three bridge tenders who first ap-
plied to Cochrane for positions were
referred by him to the patronage-sell-
ing committee. A member of the com-
mittee, Mr. Bullock, testified that Mr.
Cochrane was present during a portion
of one meeting, held in his store after
the night, while the question of offices
was under discussion. There is also abso-
lute proof that the persons who submitted
to the bleeding process got the offices, and
that the recommendation of Mr. Cochrane
was necessary before the Government
would make the appointment, while the
\$200 paid by Hedley Simpson passed
through Mr. Cochrane's hands to those of
Mr. Payne, one of the committee. In the
face of such evidence how can the com-
mittee, how can Parliament hold Mr.
Cochrane, M.P., to be wholly inno-
cent? It is so clear that even
the London Free Press says Mr.
Cochrane has forfeited his seat. Un-
fortunately for the purification of Parlia-
ment, the committee majority report in
favor of exonerating Mr. Cochrane from all
blame in the contemptible business, and
there is reason for fearing that they will be
sustained. The reasonable view is to hold
all the parties implicated guilty as proved,
and to proceed criminally against them,
as recommended by Messrs. Cameron,
of Huron, Mulock and German, the Liberal
members of the committee.

WEALTH IN TREES.

The ADVERTISER is an advocate of a
persistent effort being made to reafforest
Ontario as fast as its forest wealth is
cut down and disposed of for the public
benefit. In other words, the policy of the
forestry department should be to plant as
many young trees every year as there are
old ones cut down. Thus our timber
wealth would be replenished at compar-
atively little cost. That this policy is a
profitable one for the State and for indi-
viduals has again been demonstrated on the
Healey estate in England. Speaking to the
members of the English Arboricultural
Society, who have been making a sort
of tour of observation of the growing
timber (which must not be confounded
with fruit trees) in Durham and Northum-
berland, Mr. Hewitt stated that when the
late Mr. Osmiston bought the Healey
estate there was little or no wood upon it.but he planted about half the land with
trees, and before he died saw the first
growth cut down and the land replanted.
The gross receipts for timber sold
amounted, we are assured, to \$26,000—
certainly a very large amount to be taken
off an estate which had originally cost only
£22,000.

TOPICS OF THE DAY.

The report that Great Britain had added to
her dominions by annexing a little
Turkish island, is now stated to be in-
correct. What a flurry it created!A PORT HURON man has been killed for
going between a man and his wife to save
the latter from a serious beating. It is
evident the idea yet prevails in the
Michigan town that a man who inter-
feres in a domestic row is a common
enemy, for whom no punishment is too
severe. The court may hold a different
view when the murderer is brought to
trial.MR. CHAPLEAU will vote for the white-
washing of Sir Hector, not that he loves
the late Minister of Public Works the
more, but that he may provide a soft
place to fall upon when he is placed in a
somewhat similar predicament to that
which his antagonist in the scramble for
fat things has recently occupied.WESTERN grain men think it hurts Cana-
dian interests to have Northwest
"flooded" wheat graded as such. Canada
cannot help that. Nothing is to be gained
by concealing the truth. The North-
west is producing many million bushels of
wheat that is not flooded. Let that fact
be kept well in the foreground, but let us
not mislead the public. The country has
lost enough already by overdoing the
"flood" game. The day will come when
the frost streaks will be combatted. It
will pay to be honest and patient.A GENTLEMAN who has just returned from
Murray Bay says that the Hon. Edward
Blake has declared that he does not intend
to offer as a candidate for Kingston, and
that he will not re-enter active politics.
The greater is the pity. With a report
in favor of whitewashing Sir Hector
Langevin seriously laid before Parlia-
ment, and the further proposition made
that the sale of public offices to the
highest bidder, through the agency of a
member of Parliament, should be con-
demned, Mr. Blake would have had great
scope for his denunciatory powers.HON. MR. ABBOTT, Tuesday (introduced
into the Senate a resolution affirming that
Canada desires to be exempted from the
operation of the provisions of the British
treaties with the German Zollverein and
with Belgium. At present Canada is
compelled to admit all articles, with the
exception of manufactures of Belgium, at the
same or at no higher rate of duty than is
imposed upon similar articles of British
origin; and in the treaty with the Ger-
man Zollverein entered into in 1865, it is
stipulated that the produce of those
states shall not be subject to any higher
or other import duties than the produce
of the United Kingdom or any other
country of the like kind, and that the ex-
ports to those states shall not be subject
to any higher duties than exports to the
United Kingdom. It is contended that
these treaties are incompatible with the
right of the colonies to make their own
trade arrangements, and it is deemed
advisable that the stipulations should be
removed so that Canada may make the
best possible trade arrangements with
Great Britain as well as with the United
States.

ANOTHER SCANDAL LOOMING UP.

The astonishing fact that among Indian
expenditures were charges for beer and
cigars, and that between 1883 and 1889 the
expenditure for agricultural implements
was under one treaty, \$218,615, under three
other treaties \$201,000 for the same purpose
and on a population of 12,000, and that
during these years the total amount spent
on agricultural implements and general ex-
penses exceeded \$2,000,000, suggest the
probability of a Northwest Indian scandal
at an early day.

FOSTER'S CONSTITUENCY.

18,842 souls. In 1881 the population was
25,617, showing an increase of 6,775. The
population is now shown to be but 23,091,
a decrease of 2,526 in the past ten years.
In the same period the assessed valuation
of this fine county had decreased by over
\$800,000. Within this period of depre-
ciated values and falling population Min-
ister Foster, as representative of the county,
has been selling up the burden of taxes
and the National Policy has got in its
legitimate work. What wonder that the
honest farmers of Kings have tired of Foster
and taxation?
