Boy Suicides.

LONDON, June 25 .- Several recent sui cides of boys of 16 and younger, and two or three cases of the fatal hanging of small lads, who were imitating the stage realism of the variety shows, leads the Lancet this week to sound a note of warning. It demands the sound moral instruction of the rising generation as an imperative physical
