Founded by French Lady Under Title of "Human Rights."

London, Feb. 25.-In no other country but France would it have occurred to a lodge of Freemasons that not only was it well to admit a woman into their numbers, but that they would count it a distinct honor. they determined, to use a Masonic expression, "to put it to sleep"; that is to say, they forbade it to hold meetings, and, in fact, broke it up altogether. Nevertheless, Maria Desraismes remain-

ed the only woman Freemason. She was admitted, however, into no other lodge, and had no means of meeting the fraternity. For some time she bore it in silence, but there were among the Masons many who believed that the exclusion of women was a loss to the order, and one of the most respected among them was Dr. George Martin, a Feminist, but a fearless, unwavering disciple of truth and justice. He persuaded Maria Desraismes to initiate other women into the secrets of Free masonary, and to form a lodge which ad-

mitted men and women equally. At that time she was suffering from a cruel malady, but with characteristic courage she summoned seventeen ladies to her house, initiated them and formed a new lodge, called "Le Droit Humain" (Human Rights), the first mixed order of Freemasons in the world. This courageous woman, however, did not long survive, and she was succeeded by the wife of Dr. Martin, a woman possessed of gifts of rare tact and kindness.

The "Droit Humain" lodge now numbers everal hundred women, and is localized in Lyons, Rouen, Blois and Havre.

London, Feb. 26.-The case of Horace G. Rayner, who shot and killed William Whitely, the well-known merchant of Westbourne Grover, Jan. 24, was heard n a police court here today.
